

EDITORIAL

RETIREMENT NEEDS A RETHINK IN CAYMAN

In May this year Caymanian Times considered in an editorial whether the government - and by extension the Cayman Islands - was facing down the barrel of a post-pandemic perfect storm or sea of opportunities.

We see a dark cloud looming. But that too has a silver lining of opportunities.

As far as metaphors go, silver in this case is the natural process of aging and it begs the question: At what point and what does it take for the average Caymanian to retire comfortably? Not extravagantly. Just comfortably.

Our assessment of the current situation, compounded by long term effects of the economic downturn caused by COV-ID-19, is that this situation presents another dark and threatening cloud in our imperfect 'perfect storm' scenario.

To put it bluntly, Cayman is facing a crisis linked to retirement...and pensions.

We note the previous attempts, including by then Opposition MP now Finance Minister Chris Saunders, to bring the issue to the forefront of public debate - or at least public contemplation.

We also recall the references by candidates in the recent election campaign about the state of the pension fund; how best to invest it, the early withdrawals





necessitated by Covid, the payments deferral because of Covid and the challenges to replenish it.

Will it be addressed in the coming Strategic Policy Statement and budget presentation of the government? We hope so, given Mr Saunders' previous laudable efforts to bring this issue into the public consciousness.

As a matter of priority, Cayman needs to find the silver lining in this looming dark cloud that threatens to be an impending storm for our coming 'silver years' and for those already at that stage and struggling to cope with the reality of it.

Retirement needs an urgent rethink, especially how it is funded by both the individual and the state.

What is the state of Cayman's retirement plan? Is our current system fit for this purpose? Can we as a society afford to put our feet up in our silver years or will we have to keep plodding on just to make ends even barely meet?

We'll be addressing this issue in more detail in upcoming editions.

from It's Your Party, residents on island now have the ability to purchase a whole host of items online that can all be purchased together, much like an Amazon order, and then either delivered to the door or grouped together for collection.

Ken was well placed to establish such an online business, having already built the Fine Dine-In platform in 1999 that has allowed diners to order food from different restaurants on the same order to be delivered. He said he could see the potential for an online shopping delivery service using a similar platform. Launching the new online shopping service on 6th July, Ken gave some background as to the launch.

"We made a bunch of modifications so it fits the business model and put a business plan together and decided to execute it just now," he advised. "We wanted to wait until a decent number of companies came on board before launching it. We look at it as an Amazon for the Cayman Islands, only with local businesses. You have an option of placing your order online with multiple stores in a single order and then you can choose to either pick up the delivery yourself or have it delivered within 24-48 hours, and we're serving Grand Cayman and Cayman Brac."

Ken believed that the value of Amazon is that shoppers can go there and "pretty much buy everything", so they are hoping to have a very broad range of businesses that have a good reputation on island and have a wide range of products. In this way he believed their growth over time – like Amazon- becomes wider and wider.

The real value for the client is they don't have to drive around for hours looking for an item, not knowing if it's at the store, he said. Instead, they can simply go online, check it out and then not have to go and waste time in traffic for hours.

There is a delivery charge of CI\$6 to a location that is within 10 km of the store and CI\$10 outside that range.

"We deliver island-wide, so it's great for people in East End, Bodden Town, etc. and for Cayman Brac we contact them and give them the choice of whether they would like it shipped through Thompson Shipping or through Cayman Airways, and then we will add the delivery charges at that point," he advised.

The upside for businesses is that it's another avenue for them to sell products and get them out into the marketplace, as a lot of businesses are defined in the market as selling a particular product only, thereby giving greater exposure to a wider range of items, he said.

"It's an easy way for people to understand what businesses have available on island," Ken confirmed.

If businesses want to be part of shopcaymanislands.com, Ken said it does take quite a commit-



ment as it takes a bit of work to put products online, in particular to upload images of products.

"As with anything, it is going to be as valuable and useful and profitable for businesses the more effort they put into it," he confirmed. "When you're dealing with online sales, it's all about what people see, the visual display and the description that goes with it, and so to do that you have to spend a bit of time and present your products well."

Ken is upbeat about the uptake by the general public.

"If you provide a good service and there's a need in the market and you execute your business properly, then you have a pretty good recipe for success," he stated. "The Cayman Islands market is pretty sophisticated and they are very comfortable with going online and shopping online."

The downside of shopping overseas was the process in-

volved to actually get goods on island, including the shipping, clearing and Customs and all of the hoops that you have to go through to get your product in your hands, he said.

"People tend to gravitate to whatever is easiest and simplest, so that's why we set up the company. We want to make it simple for people, we want it to be convenient for people, and as long as we can execute properly, it will be."


very appreciative for them, bringing women together to raise money for women who need it, is truly the best."

HAITI'S PRESIDENT ASSASSINATED AND WIFE SERIOUSLY INJURED

The President of Haiti, Jovenel Moïse been assassinated in an attack at his home on Tuesday night.

President Moïse died in a hail of bullets from unknown assailants at the scene and his wife also seriously wounded was hospitalised with gunshot injuries.

No one had claimed responsibility for the murders and a motive is still unclear.

The country has been placed under a state of emergency.

Haiti has been gripped by persistent violent political upheaval and crippling poverty throughout most of its modern history

President Moïse himself was at the centre of a recent spate of political turmoil over the duration of his tenure.

He came into office in 2017 after controversial elections but his swearing-in was delayed over allegations of voter fraud.

The President has been ruling by decree for more than two years after the country failed to hold elections. He had claimed that his term should have been extended.



The opposition has been calling for him to step down but instead he had responded with a series of clampdowns.

The assassination of President Moise has been condemned throughout the region and globally.

UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson called it "an abhorrent act" and appealing for calm. US President Joe Biden said it was a "horrific assassination" and offered to "provide any assistance that's needed."

Taste of Japan at Bon Vivant

People in the Cayman Islands have developed a real love of sushi, with loads of great restaurants offering this Asian culinary classic. So, it was unsurprising to see a full house at Bon Vivant last week, when a handful of budding sushi makers gathered around the table to watch chef Maureen Cubbon, Culinary Director at Bestlife, who presents the cooking classes at Bon Vivant, along with number two, Chef Hanson, who led the sushi making for the evening.

Bon Vivant has made a name for itself over the years, offering an array of cookery classes to young and old, but that sadly came to a halt when the pandemic hit. Their sushi making class is hopefully the restart of Bon Vivant's highly popular cooking classes, which have, in the past, showcased how to make everything from brioche to pasta.

Hilary Van Loon, Bon Vivant's Retail Sales and Service Lead, was the MC for the event and ensured that all guests were happy at their seat and well supplied with wine throughout the event.

Chef Maureen explained that the class was highly interactive and everybody would be getting the chance to create their own sushi masterpiece.

"The idea is we want you to get a bit hands-on and understand all the moving parts," Chef Maureen explained. "We want you to at least try to recreate this at home."

All ingredients supplied were easily available at Cayman's supermarkets, she said.

Rice is king

Chef Hanson then led the way, explaining the intricacies of the art of sushi making. Rice, he said, was the key ingredient and it should be Japanese rice, but not necessarily 'sushi rice' which tended to push up the price if it had that label. Rice was precooked and then marinated overnight in a salt/sugar/rice vinegar marinade.

"Sushi actually means 'sour taste'," he advised. "Hundreds of years ago, it used to be just a procedure for the Japanese to preserve fish via fermentation and, once they were ready to eat the fish, they would throw away the rice, but a Japanese chef cooked the rice and served it with the fish and that was when sushi was born."

The first roll guests made was futomaki, a type of sushi which has the nori (seaweed) on the outside and should only include four or five ingredients, he ad-

A beautifully presented station greeted each event-goer, complete with nori sheets for rolling, already cooked shrimp, neatly sliced cucumber, some sticky rice already pre-cooked and a selection of condiments. Prepping ahead of time was essential for sushi making, Chef Maureen advised.

Chef Hanson explained the importance of the nori to Japanese people:

"Japanese love their seaweed, they dry it out and use it for stocks for sauces and especially sushi," he advised.

Guests were invited (once hands had been washed) to slice their avocado and then rub their hands with sesame oil to prevent sticking, before squishing the sticky rice on the inside of their nori sheet with their thumb, covering it in about a quarter inch layer and leaving a gap at the top of the sheet.

"The idea is to spread it thinly and all the way over from side to side, with about an inch gap at the top and all the way to the bottom," Chef Maureen advised.

Sesame seeds were sprinkled over and then cucumber strips were then piled high in the middle and then avocado slices and shrimp were carefully laid out horizontally. Using a sushi rolling bamboo mat covered in cling film to keep it clean, guests carefully and tightly rolled their sushi. The movement was surprisingly easy and guests created perfect rolls with their ingredients.

Chef Hanson gave a helpful cutting tip in that you should dip the tip of your knife in water and then let the water drain along the cutting edge of the knife (which should be very sharp), the water preventing the knife from sticking to the rice as you cut.

"The thing about slicing sushi is you don't have to saw, it's cut in one motion, and you begin

cutting in the middle of the roll," Chef Hanson explained.

Having tucked into their now perfectly formed sushi, guests also were able to make an 'outside' roll, called Uramaki which contained fresh tuna that was piped in a horizontal line across the rice covered nori and then rolled. Chef Maureen then demonstrated an amazing yakitori chicken on skewers that she had prepared and cooked earlier, complete with a divine satay sauce that guests could dip their chicken into. She also demonstrated a delicious pho (pronounced 'far') bowl that she made that contained an intense broth that was the key to the success of the dish, deeply flavoured with star anise and cinnamon.

Armed with leftovers in take out boxes and a gift of a sushi rolling mat and wooden paddle, guests left feeling that they had learnt a great deal about the fascinating cuisine of Japan.

Liquor Licence Applications Move Online



Grand Cayman Liquor License holders – including those with music and dancing licences – are reminded of the upcoming Annual Liquor Licensing Meeting which will be held on September 13, 2021. The deadline for applications is August 13, 2021.

The Liquor Licensing Board in conjunction with the Department of Commerce and Investment (DCI) is pleased to announce that as of July 9, 2021, persons renewing their licences may now do so online at https://www.dci.gov.ky/licensing. Licence holders will need the current trade and business licence number associated to the current liquor licence number in order to complete the online renewal process.

Liquor Licences renewed for the September 2020 annual session will receive a temporary reduction of the annual renewal fees for 2021 per the Liquor Licensing (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 2020. This reduction of fees does not apply to

music and dancing licences or liquor licences granted during the September 2020 annual session, and subsequent quarterly sessions.

If a variation is required, this must be submitted along with the renewal application at the Business Licensing Counter on the 1st floor of the Government Administration Building.

Licence holders are reminded the below documents are not required with the renewal application:

- 1. Police clearances certificates
- 2. Inspections by the Planning Department
- 3. Annual inspections of the licensed premises by the Department of Environmental Health and the Cayman Islands Fire Services. While these inspections are no longer required to apply to renew a license, the licensed premises must be inspected annually by Department of Environmental Health and the Cayman Islands Fire Services. It is the responsibility of the Licensee to have these inspections completed.
- 4. The Board will be notified at the annual session by the relevant Departments on any premises deemed unsatisfactory during the inspection process, prior to the



Board's decision for such license to be is-

Ambassador LaRocque offered congratulations to Hon. Wayne Panton on his recent election and welcomed him to his first Conference of Heads of Government as Premier of the Cayman Islands.

Key agenda items being discussed by regional leaders include:

• Updates on regional disasters including the eruption of La Soufrière Volcano in St. Vincent and the Grenadines; flooding

in Guyana and Suriname and the impact of Hurricane Elsa;

- Covid-19 and its impact on the Re-
- Prioritising regional food and nutrition security;
- Tax transparency, Blacklisting, De-risking and the Global Minimum Corporate Tax; &
 - Crime and security issues.

Premier Hon. Wayne Panton noted, "The importance of regional cooperation

was clearly demonstrated especially during the past 18 months as Cayman was able to support many of our neighbors, but also receive exceptional assistance from CARPHA (a key CARICOM body) with testing and monitoring the spread of COVID-19 during the early days of the pandemic. The Caribbean has been identified as the region experiencing the greatest economic impact from the COVID-19 pandemic given our dependence on Tourism. Furthermore, the CARICOM com-

munity remains vulnerable to a litany of challenges including natural disasters, climate change and global economic shocks. This reinforces one of the key platforms of the PACT Government that we must commit now, both locally and regionally to building resilient and more sustainable communities."

The Conference continues through Tuesday, 6th July 2021 and the Premier's participation is being supported by the Cabinet Office.

Premier dismayed at assassination of Haiti's president

Premier G. Wayne Panton expressed dismay at the news of the armed attack early this morning, which took the life of Haiti's President Jovenel Moise

"It is with sadness that we learned this morning of the assassination of Mr. Moise and we continue to pray for the healing and recovery his wife, First Lady Martine Moise, who was injured in the shooting," Mr. Panton said. "The entire incident is not only tragic, but it is extremely shocking. There is no room for violence in any democracy."

The attack came at the President's private residence early Wednesday morning.

CARICOM has requested all members to fly flags at half-mast for three days, be-

ginning today, and again on the day of Mr. Moise's funeral.

"Our thoughts and prayers are with the people of Haiti who have suffered so much already," Mr. Panton said.









Alden's Farm Tour

"Do you see that mahogany tree there? "My grandfather told me that was a big tree when he was a boy," said former Premier, Alden McLaughlin as he showed us

around his 23-Acre farm in the middle of East End. Mr. McLaughlin was showing some of George Town constituents around, courtesy of Barbara Connolly MP, who had arranged a lovely day out for them, and they loved it. It was like walking around

the Garden of Eden.

There are lots of farms out here, making use of the water they pump up from the huge freshwater lens that runs between East End and Frank Sound. Mr. McLaughlin uses a combination of drip-irrigation, which involves lots of pipes that takes the water straight to the root of the plant, and spraying. Spraying fruit trees twice a week during dry times is part of his secret to a bumper crop, he says.

Mr. McLaughlin presently has about half of the land cultivated, but his aim, now that he has more time on his hands, is to cultivate all of it. There is already just about everything you can think of, including fruits trees of all kinds, and vegetables too. "I've got about a thousand fruit trees - I grow mango, avocado, sweetsop, soursop, naseberry, June plum, red plum, yellow plum, jackfruit, lime, and we always

have papaya too, and coconut. Then we do cucumbers, tomatoes, eggplant, Chinese cabbage, bok choy, tomatoes, watermelon, and cantaloupe," he said. There are also several dragon fruit plants, which are in the cactus family, and need to be grown on wooden frames. I was amazed at the variety of crops he had managed to cultivate. Variety is good, because it makes natural barriers for pests and diseases. One pest might like one type of crop, but they will not attack everything. It also means that several crops are always "in season," so that steady income can be maintained all year round.

Like many Eastern District farms, the soils are quite thin over the rock. But the red soil is good, and, with a mixture of drip and spray irrigation using water pumped up from the underground lens, there is a lot you can do to care for it and enrich it. "It's one of my plans to build some composting bins with those pallets. I have it in


my mind how we are going to build them. As it breaks down, it will fall through into a tray, and then you pull the tray out," Mr. McLaughlin said.

But there are other ways of enriching the soil: "I got the 'magic' - pig manure," Mr. Mr. McLaughlin said. Apparently, there is nothing like pig manure for fertilizing the soil. He recently started a piggery with 42 pigs in it. How does that work out in terms of feed cost? "It only costs him about 10 dollars a day to feed all those pigs," he says, because he uses all the fruits that are not pretty enough to sell. "They eat mangoes, papaya, just about anything. Also, I sell most of my stuff at Kirks, and so we pick up four or those big garbage containers full of peelings, and discarded fruits and vegetables (to feed to the pigs)."

It's good to incorporate livestock onto a farm that is mostly fruits and vegetables, because animals can help complete nature's system of recycling nutrients, so its really a win-win, if you manage it just right. The more variety you have on a farm, the more you can manage it so that each animal or plant has its own productive niche. But it can take time to see how everything fits together in practice. People have been telling Mr. McLaughlin that he needs some goats too, but he wants to see how the pigs work out first, he says.

As Mr. McLaughlin took us around, we could see some sweet pepper plants. They are normally one of his big-sellers, because there is a lot of demand for bell-peppers, but some of the leaves looked as if they were wilting. Not enough water? No, "That is ants, attacking the roots," Mr. McLaughlin said, as he explained that you couldn't really treat the soil for ants until the crop was finished.

"We're going to have a really good avocado crop unless we get bad weather. I deliberately planted ones that mature at different stages of the year, so I start picking avocados in June all the way through to March," Mr. McLaughlin said.

OPINIONS DIVIDED OVER ENGLAND'S REOPENING PLAN

Opinions are deeply divided over the British government's announced policy of lifting almost all of the current COVID restrictions in England.

The removal of the measures including some quarantine requirements was outlined by Prime Minister Boris Johnson this past Monday and take effect respectively on July 19th for social restrictions and August 16th for quarantine.

As of July 19th face masks will no longer be legally required and distancing rules will be scrapped at the final stage of England's Covid lockdown roadmap, Boris Johnson has confirmed.

The rule of six inside private homes will be removed and work-from-home guidance abolished including access to restaurants, nightclubs and other public venues.

From August 16th persons who have had two vaccinations - double-jabbed - will not have to quarantine upon returning to the UK from an amber listed country.

School children will also no longer need to isolate unless they test positive for Covid after August 16th. That ends a controversial bubble system that forces entire classes into isolation if one student tests positive.

Prime Minister Boris Johnson has said that from July 19th wearing a face mask will become a matter of "personal choice".

That contrasts with the advice of the World Health Organization (WHO) which says that mask-wearing should continue to be mandatory in crowded places.

The government's new strategy coincides - some observers say it was accelerated - with the appointment of a new Health Secretary, former Chancellor (Finance Minister) Sajid Javid, who has replaced the disgraced Matt Hancock.

Mr Hancock has resigned over a scandal in which he was caught on camera in his office kissing and cavorting with one of his aides in an extra-marital affair.

Mr Javid's more aggressive stance on reopening contrasts with the comparatively cautious approach of Mr Hancock, according to some observers.

The new Health Secretary has admitted that the move to unlock the economy was taking the country into what he called "uncharted territory", but argues that it is critical to prevent further economic decline.

The pace at which the government is now pushing through lifting the restrictions and opening up the economy, especially as cases of the "hyper-contagious" Delta variant continues to rise, has met with reservations inside and outside the country.

This new strategy has deepened the political rift between the government and the opposition Labour Party over the management of the pandemic.

Mr Johnson said the decision to end most of the restrictions in England was due to the success of the vaccine rollout weakening the link between cases and deaths.

His remarks that "we must reconcile ourselves, sadly, to more deaths from Covid" has triggered outrage by the opposition Labour Party and others who have accused the Prime Minister of being playing politics with people's lives.

During the weekly Prime Minister's Questions(PMQs) this past Wednesday, the leaders of the opposition Sir Keir Starmer accused the Prime Minister of being "reckless".

But Mr Johnson countered, saying the reopening is being done "in a controlled way" and that the strategy was "cautious and prudent".

He said they were giving the public more say in making their own decisions by removing legal restrictions.

However, his stance on giving people what he called "personal choice", contrasts with the advice of the World Health Organization(WHO) which says that mask-wearing should continue



to be mandatory in crowded places.

And while the British government is removing the restrictions in England, some European countries are refusing to accept British tourists due to the increasing Delta-driven Covid cases in the UK.

UK government officials have already projected that case numbers could hit up to 100,000 over the summer.

Mr Johnson himself has warned cases were predicted to rise to 50,000 a day from as early as later this month.

However, even though hospitalisations are increasing, the government points to the continued success of the UK's vaccination campaign. However, this comes against the concern that the mutations of the virus could threaten the efficacy of the current regime of vaccines.

Official data shows that hospitalisations from COVID-19 are on the rise again in the UK - up by 38% in the past week, the fastest rate since October 2020.

Concerns have already been raised about the huge crowds although not at capacity - allowed into major UEFA football events which some experts worry could be superspreader events.


It is felt that despite efforts to ensure a safe environment, this could still result in potentially hundreds, possibly thousands, of people having to isolate, being off work and jeopardising the hopes for an economic recovery.

To boost vaccine numbers, people living in London - which has the lowest vaccine uptake in the country - have been offered free tickets to the Euro 2020 cup final at Wembley Stadium this Sunday if they book a Covid-19 vaccination appointment.



It turns out that a nap is exactly what you need in the afternoons when drowsiness takes over your body and mind.



from a heart-related complication decreases in nap-takers (37% for those who nap at least 3 times per week!), and the release of growth hormone aids in weight loss.

How to power nap

15-30 minutes seems to be the sweet spot for the best power nap. Berkley biology students report that naps must be short in order to most effective. When naps exceed 45 minutes, the benefits begin to disappear. Just a 30 minute snooze can improve cognitive faculties by about 40%, according to NASA researchers.

Many people naturally wake up after 15-

a longer nap-taker, set an alarm to awaken you so you do not over sleep. Keeping your nap at 30 minutes or less will also prevent you from being overly groggy upon waking.

Here are some tips to have a successful power nap:

- Try to be consistent. The best time for napping is between 1 and 3 in the afternoon, or approximately 8 hours after waking in the morning.
- Darken the room. Darkness causes your body to produce melatonin, which helps you fall asleep. If you can't darken the room, put on a sleep mask or even drape a jacket over your face.
- Stay warm. Your body temperature drops while you sleep. Keep a blanket or jacket nearby to help stay warm.
- Control noise. If noise bothers you while you sleep, turn on a fan or white noise machine. Better yet, use and iPhone App like Mind Tuner. It's great for napping, waking up, enhancing creativity and increasing focus!








Trinidad's vaccinated sailors can return

Trinidad and Tobago's Yacht Services Association is grateful to Prime Minister Keith Rowley for allowing sailors – if vaccinated – to sail into their waters again from next week.

The news that vaccinated yachters can soon enter "comes as desperately needed news" for workers in the sector.

Rowley said the yachters, once vaccinated, will be allowed entry since the borders will be opened but the issue of

cruise ships has been discussed but no decision taken yet.

Rowley said: "After almost 16 months of having the industry effectively shuttered, we are almost in disbelief that we may finally have our livelihoods restored. While we have maintained that visitors from yachts and sailboats in the Caribbean pose little threat, we understand that difficult

decisions were made that affected many industries."

According to the rules for entry into TT from July 17, foreigners must be fully vaccinated with World Health Organisation-approved vaccines administered at least two weeks before entry. They must also present a negative PCR test, not older than 72 hours before arrival.

Elsa fizzles out into storm

Tropical Storm Elsa was tracking northward through the Gulf of Mexico and brought heavy rain, strong winds gusts, storm surge and isolated tornadoes to Florida through Wednesday. Elsa then spread some of its impact up the southeast and mid-Atlantic coasts. Bands of heavy rain and gusty winds have spread into South Florida, producing isolated tornadoes at times.

Elsa made landfall in Cuba on Monday, after 180,000 people were evacuated from southern regions amid fears of heavy flooding. It swept over western Cuba near Havana with strong rain and winds. The storm was passing over mainly rural areas to the east of Havana after making landfall near Ciénega de Zapata, a natural park with few inhabitants.

The Cuba government opened shelters and protected sugarcane and cocoa crops ahead of the storm.

Elsa moved near Montego Bay, Jamaica, and was speeding westnorth-west at 17mph by Sunday. It had maximum sustained winds of 65mph, according to the National Hurricane Centre in Miami. It killed one person in St Lucia and a 15-year-old boy and a 75-year-old woman died Saturday in separate events in the Dominican Republic after walls collapsed on them.

Elsa was a Category 1 hurricane until Saturday morning, causing widespread damage in several eastern Caribbean islands on Friday, as the first hurricane of the Atlantic season.

Among the hardest hit was Barbados, where more than 1,100 people reported damaged

houses, including 62 homes that completely collapsed as the government promised to find and fund temporary housing to avoid clustering people in shelters amid the pandemic.

Grenada may name sex offenders

The Grenada government is considering publishing the names of convicted sexual offenders and it could be approved by parliament before year-end.

Attorney General, Dia Forrester said that the register will be under the control and custody of the Commissioner of Police and is intended to be separated into two parts.

"One portion containing the relevant information on the sex offenders and the oth-

er portion containing the specific information available to the public," Forrester said.

"This approach seeks to avoid contravention of a constitutional right of a person to the protection of privacy in his home."

Sexual crimes against minors have shown an alarming increase in recent

years. In the first quarter of 2021, the police said that from its records, children under eight are heavily targeted by men

Sexual offenses are one of the convicted records that will not be expunged under the Rehabilitation Offenders Bill which went into effect a few years ago.

St Kitts gets mass vaccinated

St Kitts and Nevis has quickly got its startling coronavirus outbreak under control. It has secured an additional 5,000 doses of the Oxford/AstraZeneca coronavirus vaccines.

The second phase of the vaccination programme commences on Thursday. In the first phase of the vaccination programme, a total of 41,850 doses of the vaccines were administered to citizens and residents in the SKN.

Also, 22,937 adults or 69.4 percent of the target population, received at least one dose of the vaccine and 18,913 adults or 57.2 percent received both doses

Suns aim to eclipse the Bucks

The NBA Finals have finally started with the Phoenix Suns taking on the Milwaukee Bucks in the best-of-seven series.

First match was on Tuesday. At the start of the regular season expectations were that LeBron James' LA Lakers would face Kevin Durant's Brooklyn Nets but after injuries and upsets, it's the Suns and Bucks facing up.

The Suns were not expected to reach this far when the season started in December, but the signs of progress were there.

They had an impressive end to the 2019-20 season, as a Devin Booker-inspired team won eight straight games in the NBA bubble, just missing out on the playin tournament.

The off-season proved pivotal. The Suns traded for All-Star point guard Chris Paul, who had lead the Oklahoma City Thunder to the play-offs a season earlier.

It was their biggest trade since acquiring Charles Barkley before the 1992-93 season, the last time the Suns reached the NBA Finals.

With franchise star Booker now alongside an elite point guard in Paul, it set the tone for an all-action team ready to make a run at the play-offs.

The Bucks have finally got over the line. They've been so close before, finishing as the Eastern Conference number one seed in the past two seasons.

But, it's the play-offs where they've come unstuck.

The 2018-19 season saw them lose out to eventual champions Toronto Raptors in the Western Conference finals, with the Miami Heat winning the conference semi-final last season.

Led by two-time MVP Giannis Antetokounmpo and his surrounding cast of All-Star Khris

Middleton, Jrue Holiday and PJ Tucker, the Bucks got the job

Their play-off run started with a 4-0 sweep of last year's finalists the Miami Heat, which led to a semi-final meeting with the star-studded Brooklyn Nets.

Before their semi-final it looked a clear path to the final for Brooklyn, with All-Star trio Kevin

Durant, Kyrie Irving and James Harden poised to progress.

But, injuries to Irving and Harden gave the Bucks the upper hand and saw them take a 4-3 series victory.

They came up against the Atlanta Hawks in the Eastern Conference finals, with talisman Trae Young leading the opposition attack.

Again injuries were pivotal to this series, but this time the Bucks suffered as well.

A knee injury to Antetokounmpo in game four with the series tied at 2-2 could have led to another playoff heartbreak for Milwaukee.

But Mike Budenholzer's roster pulled together for back-to-back wins to clinch their place in the NBA Finals.

Brazil expect another Copa crown

Brazil are into the Copa America final after Lucas Paqueta sent the defending champions through with a first-half winner against Peru at the Nilton Santos Stadium in Rio de Janeiro.

Neymar beat three defenders on the left before crossing for Paqueta to guide home the semi-final's only goal.

Brazil, who have won

the Copa America every time they hosted the tournament, face either Argentina or Colombia in Saturday's final at the Maracana.

"I want Argentina, I am cheering them on," Neymar said. "I have friends there and in the final Brazil will win."

Paris St-Germain forward Neymar was a bright spark for Brazil as thev again edged Peru, the side their beat

Peru goalkeeper Pedro Gallese made a fine double save from pointblank range to deny Neymar and Richarlison early on.

McGregor can't stop coming back
