

# Mangroves plant out at Barkers

Young people taking part in the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award got together with the staff of Cayman Turtle Centre to plant some red mangrove seedlings at Barker's National Park in West Bay. The seedlings all came from the Cayman Turtle Centre's mangrove exhibit, which seeks to replicate a small portion of mangrove ecosystem at the edge of the Turtle Centre's big Saltwater Lagoon.

The exhibit has been established for ten years, and the red mangroves began putting out seeds which were more than the Centre needed to replenish the trees in the ecosystem. Adam Jackson who is the Lead Aquarist at the Centre and a Duke of Edinburgh Gold Award winner, along with some of the other team, decided to start planting them out at Barkers National Park here in Cayman will be having a planting of seedling mangrove trees up in Barkers, West Bay.

Over a dozen Duke of Edinburgh Award

volunteers came to help plant 16 of the seedlings in a foot or so of water about ten meters from the shore. They are planted in small concrete troughs, sunk into the substrate, so that the mangroves still while they put down their deep taproots, and then spread out to the sides. Soil is put inside the troughs, and then covered with gravel so that the lapping of the waves doesn't wash it away.



# COVID-19 Update: One COVID-19 Related Death Reported

On Thursday, 27 October, 2022, the Health Services Authority reported one COVID-19 related death. The individual had received 2 doses of the vaccine, no boosters and had severe comorbidities.

The Ministry of Health and Wellness would like to extend condolences to the family.


Incoming Chief Medical Officer, Dr Nick Gent, stresses the importance of the vaccination and the booster doses, especially among the elderly and immunocompromised.

"The Moderna (bivalent) booster is on island, and I encourage our elderly and immunocompromised, as well as their caretakers and healthcare workers, to get boosted" Dr Gent stated. "As it has

been said often, research has shown us that the two doses of the vaccination in conjunction with the recommended booster doses will keep people out of the hospital, so I stress once again: get vaccinated and boosted."

As announced in late August, COVID-19 reports to the public will be limited to hospitalisations and deaths. Any notable increases in hospitalisations, as well as any new deaths, will be announced to the public immediately.

Hon. Bernie Bush; Minister for Youth, Sports, Culture & Heritage encouraged the young volunteers: "Thank you...I think it's an awesome thing to do. This is a beautiful little country. There are not too many places like this in the world and this belongs to you all. Continue to get involved in things like this, please, and make it a better place than when you found it.

The Turtle Centre's Adam Jackson said: "We took a few seedlings that were catching, and we put them in our shoreline nursery. So they started to grow really well and they settled themselves in to the exhibit. We left them alone to see how far they would go. Well we were kind of not paying too much attention, just letting them grow, and all of a sudden we saw all of these lovely mangrove seeds coming from them We have been collecting 50 to 60 seeds every two to three weeks and we were wondering what to do with them. Cayman Turtle Centre gives back to the environment by our turtle releases. We also give back through our parrot and other bird releases.

"We said we could give back to the environment by planting these guys out so we started a little growing facility at the Cayman Turtle

Centre. My team and I are going to come out here every two to three weeks to check on their progress. In about six to eight months, they're going to put their stilt roots out around the concrete base, anchoring them further, and that's how they will expand."

Turtle Centre Aquarist Jennifer Robinson explained just why red mangroves are so important: "they help stop storm surges which are coming with climate change as well as coastal erosion. They also filter all of the runoff water that is carried out into the ecosys-

"Mangrove forests absorb ten times more carbon dioxide than a regular forest or so to have them is really important for our little island and really necessary for us to do our part," she said. "These are also nurseries for all the fish that we see around our islands and our reefs. So they are helping us to have a healthy ecosystem around our islands so that tourism remains popular.

Caitlyn, 18, a student of Triple C School and participant in the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award said: "I feel I need to help out with Cayman's environment and its essential, not only for Cayman's ocean life but our life as well because it helps when bad weather comes, and it also helps our sea life.

USA male and female volleyball teams won the two-day Cayman Islands leg of the NORCECA Under 23 Beach Volleyball TouSeven Mile Beach on Oct 29 and 31. Cayman male and female teams tried hard and put on a great show to be proud of. The Under 23 Tournament is being hosted by the Cayman Islands for the first time with 14 teams competing (7 male, 7 female) from Cayman, Aruba, Canada, Jamaica, Trinidad & Tobago and the USA.

The tournament was opened today by Hon. Bernie Bush, Minister for Youth, Sports, Culture & Heritage, Cayman Islands Government and Mushtaque Mohammed, Vice President of the NORCECA Volleyball Confederation.

"The Ministry of Sports is committed to developing our young athletes, and seeing them succeed at the national and international level," said Minister Bush, who opened with the first serve. "We are proud to support the Cayman Islands Volleyball Federation as they offer programmes and organise tournaments such as this one which give our young volleyballers international exposure and valuable experience."

# Statement by MP Joey Hew, The Deputy Leader Of The Opposition

Comment on CNS Article on the Pre-election Spending By The NRA

An article on the Cayman News Service blog site had a headline stating that a recent report by the Office of the Auditor General (OAG) "finds pre-election abuse of public cash" with work carried out by the National Roads Authority (NRA).

In fact, the OAG report did not say that the Auditor General found any abuse at all. There was a concern that abuse could occur, but there was no indication that any abuse was found. There is a good reason for that – it's because there was no abuse of public funds.

What should be obvious is that the NRA working to complete the road works that were budgeted for and that it had committed to doing should be a positive thing. The NRA had indicated in mid-2020 that it would be accelerating the road infrastructure projects to make up for time lost due to the pandemic. This was reported widely in the media, including by CNS. These included work on the East West Arterial



extension, Shamrock Road widening, the Kings connector, the airport connector road, and the Godfrey Nixon Way extension

I supported the NRA's decision to accelerate delivery and welcomed their commitment to getting more road improvements delivered. Acceleration was

necessary to make up for time lost because of the pandemic, and with reduced traffic volumes on our roads, this was an ideal time to get as much work completed as possible prior to the country opening to tourism again.

At the time, I said: "We are using this time as an opportunity for the National Roads Authority to proceed with critical road construction and pavement rehabilitation projects that would prove more difficult and costly to achieve during regular traffic conditions."

So, the CNS headline is disappointing and misleading as it wrongly paints the men and the women who lead the NRA as possibly being 'corrupt'. Nothing could be further from the truth, especially with no evidence provided, only ill-conceived presumptions.

The NRA is an independent Authority that is charged with one task – to use public funds to build the road infrastructure

that it deems necessary for the benefit of the people of the Cayman Islands. There is no abuse of public funds in the NRA spending those funds for the purpose they were intended.

As the Minister responsible, it was my role to support the NRA and work with them to ensure they could deliver their programme and to hold them to account for their effectiveness. That is the role I carried out throughout my time in office, including in the pre-election period. I did not interfere with the work of the NRA.

In closing, I am surely glad that the NRA sought to fix the problems facing the travelling public, especially those coming from the Eastern Districts and all those from Prospect & Red Bay who must traverse the Tomlinson, Prospect and Hurleys roundabouts. I am equally glad that the now Minister has continued the roadworks that we started, and I am hopeful that he will get these much-needed projects completed.

# Statement On the Opposition Not Attending The Swearing In Of The New Chief Justice

There have been assertions and criticisms in various media outlets that the Opposition members of Parliament did not attend the swearing-in of the new Chief Justice of the Cayman Islands, the Hon. Margaret Ramsey-Hale. An invitation was sent to Sir Alden McLaughlin KC, the MP for Red Bay, however, it was

not received by him until after the event. No other member of the Opposition was invited to this event. At the very least, the Leader of the Opposition, which is a Constitutionally defined position, should have been invited, as would normally be the protocol.

The Opposition members of Parlia-

ment again congratulate the new Chief Justice on her appointment to this high office and wish her every success. It should be noted that this is a momentous occasion for women in the Cayman Islands with the appointment of Justice Ramsay-Hale to the top post in the Judiciary.



#### TechCayman's Immersive Robotics Camp Returns for the New Academic Year

Machine Learning Robotics by TechCayman recently held their first two-day immersive camp of the 2022-2023 academic year and will be holding monthly camps until summer.

This first camp, which features two fun filled days of STEM learning, had eight participants between the ages of 11 and 14. It was the first experience with robotics for most of the campers. Upon arrival, students split into teams of two and are assigned a dedicated robotics mentor. The teams are then tasked with creating fully functioning robots, complete with brains and sensors. Mark, one of the participants with no robotics experience said, "My favorite parts of the whole camp were the challenges we had to complete with our robots."

After constructing the robots, the students receive a crash course in basic programming fundamentals, geared to "start them off thinking like programmers," says Program Coordinator Phil Liu. "Then, the students are encouraged to use their imaginations and to program their robots

anyway they please. This teaches critical thinking and problem-solving skills."

A young participant named Alexander said, "We built our robot incorrectly at first and we had to dissemble the entire robot to fix it. We still ended up being the first to program our robot and to feel ready with it." Another camper, Dominik, remarked, "My favorite part of the whole experience was testing my robot's code. What I liked about programming throughout the camp was being able to build my own design."

Various increasingly complex puzzles for the robots to solve independently as are also introduced, then the participants are given the option of either working on the puzzles provided or exploring the capabilities of the robots in their mentored teams. Another young participant remarked, "There were some things I did expect, like creating robots, and some I didn't expect, like the maze that the robots drive through...the camp was enjoyable and I liked it."

After two intensive days of building and programming robots, there were several

brand-new solutions presented by the teams. "It is always surprising that even after all the camps we have held over the past few years, campers at Machine Learning Robotics are still able to come up with new solutions we haven't thought of before. It's really fantastic seeing the kids working together in teams with their mentors," said Liu.

# **Police Investigate Armed Robbery** in Bodden Town

Just after 8.30PM on Friday, police were dispatched to a report of an armed robbery said to have taken place at the Mostyn's Esso Gas Station on Bodden Town Road.

It was reported that four men dressed in dark coloured clothing entered the store of the gas station three of whom were armed with hand guns and made demands for cash and other items. The four men made off with a quantity of cash, liquor and cigarettes in an unknown direction.

Police did an extensive search of the area where the incident occurred and the police helicopter was also deployed to assist with locating the four men, however, they were not located.

## North Side Man Charged with Murder and other Offenses



Just after 11AM today, Friday 28 October, investigators with the RCIPS arrested a 31-year-old-man of North Side on suspicion of murder, relative to the Martin Drive shooting incident that took place on 1 July, 2021. During this incident,

Following his arrest, the North Side man was for-

mally charged with two counts of Murder, one count of Attempted Murder, and Possession of an Unlicensed Firearm. He appeared in court ton Friday 28 October where he was remanded until 11 November, 2022.

## **Police Investigate Wounding Incident** in Bodden Town

Just before 7PM Wednesday, 26 October, police and other emergency services were dispatched by the 9-1-1 Communications Unit to a report of a stabbing incident in the Belford Estates area of Bodden Town. It was reported that a man and a woman who are known to each other had a physical altercation resulting in the man receiving several stab wounds. He was transported to the hospital by ambulance where he was treated for serious, but non-life-threatening injuries, and later released.

The woman, age 29, of Bodden Town, was arrested in relation to this wounding incident. She too received non-life-threatening injuries and was treated at the hospital and returned custody. She has since been bailed pending further investigations.

# Cayman duo race in Bahamas

Two Cayman Islands jet-ski riders join racers from the United States, the Caribbean, Europe and Australia in Nassau this week for the P1 AquaX Bahamas World Championship. The iconic Atlantis Paradise Island resort hosts the three-day event from Friday with the opening day including practice, testing and qualifying, followed by six races across the weekend.

The World Championship will feature more than 35 professional and amateur endurance riders, who have primarily qualified through performances in the USA national race series. Cayman's Seth Watler and Cline Glidden, who qualified through the P1 AquaX Cayman Islands National Tour, will compete. Pro rider Watler was the first Cayman Islands Watercraft Association national champion before taking a few years off from racing. Glidden competes in the Pro Am class. He has been at the top of amateur racing in the Cayman Islands in recent years.

The Pro Enduro riders will be competing for the P1 AquaX world title, with the amateur racers battling for the P1 AquaX Amateur International Cup. The action will be broadcast in the United States on the Bally Sports Regional Networks and CBS Sports Network, with international coverage on leading sports channels in more than 100 million homes in over 50 countries

CIWA President Chris Bodden said: "We partnered with P1 AquaX this year to stage a three-round series on Grand Cayman and we knew that this affiliation would push our riders and give them the opportunity to compete with the best endurance

racers in the world. We know Seth and Cline will do Cayman proud and we will all be tuned into the action to cheer them on. I want to thank all of our sponsors, partners and supporters who made this all possible. Go Team Cayman!"

Ventisha Conolly, Events Manager at Cayman Islands Ministry of Youth, Sports, Culture and Heritage, said: "We saw some great competition on the water and the Ministry is looking forward to welcoming more young Caymanian racers, including female riders, to the sport."

Watler, 30, was born and grew up in New Orleans and moved to the Cayman Islands aged 11. He began racing in 2008 and became national champion two years later. "I grew up with the need for speed and rode dirt bikes back in Louisiana," he said. "I practice on the water at least once a week and do fitness training three times a week. In addition, I incorporate a supplemented nutrition programme into my fitness schedule. This will be my first

overseas race event and I have prepared well to compete in The Bahamas."

Glidden, 25, started racing ten years ago and became the Am class national champion this year. "I attribute my success to being consistent and having a good team around me," he said. "I've competed overseas in a number of sports but not in personal watercraft racing, so I'm nervous but looking forward to racing against the best in the world."

Directed by CNCO Orchestra founder Sue Horrocks, and Simon Donoghue, the show promises a rich experience.



## Antigua starts Nigeria flights

Antigua and Grenada have solidly forged links with West Africa this week.

The historic first direct flight between Antigua and West Africa was scheduled to arrive on Tuesday and a Grenada passport now allows second-citizen mobility for Nigerians.

The inaugural flight of Antigua Airways – a partnership between the government and Nigerian-based printing firm, Marvelous Mike Press Limited – was scheduled to touch down at

the VC Bird International Airport on November 1, Antigua and Barbuda's Independence.

Prime Minister Gaston Browne confirmed that the flight was due to depart Lagos on October 31, before returning to Nigeria on November 6.

The new airline has been touted by the government as a major investment coup for Antigua and Barbuda, with the direct link to West Africa having the potential for significant economic benefit.

The carrier is also set to play a

role in boosting regional connectivity, through a yet-to-be-finalised partnership with LIAT 2020.

While Marvelous Mike is financing the airline's operations, Antigua and Barbuda is expected to receive 20 percent of the profits

Opposition politicians expressed scepticism about the new airline, raising questions over the status of the Abuja-based company behind it.

The airline is slated to offer three weekly connections from

Saint John's to Lagos, Accra in Ghana and Toronto, Canada. The company has a single Boeing 767-300ER aircraft, which has 16 business class and 251 economy class seats.

Sheila Harris, a licensed local agent and consultant on Grenada citizenship by investment, said that the Grenada passport allows second-citizen mobility for Nigerians.

Harris who made the announcement at a dinner reception organised by Hengsheng Group, developers of the Grenada National Resort in Lagos, said the benefits of holding a second citizen Grenada passport are far and wide. The Grenada passport provides holders with the opportunity to travel to around 144 countries visa-free.

The passport also allows applicants to apply for a visa to the US to operate a business, which she stated has become attractive for some clients. "Grenada is a beautiful island and we hope to continue on this trajectory that we have seen that makes people choose a Grenada passport."

Harris said that the Hengsheng Group chose Nigeria because it is the most populous country in Africa, adding that the strict diligence in the application process for the citizen by investments will not allow stolen funds into the island.

She said: "Grenada has one of the strictest due diligence programmes within the Caribbean region and for that reason, some people have avoided Grenada and this makes it not a haven for stolen funds."

According to Idowu Olumide, regional director for Africa and organiser of the event, Grenada citizenship by investment will provide the opportunity for Nigerians to tap into the tourism opportunities in Grenada, thus enabling them to diversify their investment portfolios.

# Cuba celebrates first same-sex marriages

A Cuban lesbian couple that had been dating for seven years became one of the first same-sex couple to be legally married there last week.

Lisset Díaz and Liusba Grajales walked up the ten steps of the notary office, their hands clenched and shaking. An hour later they were officially wives.

Same-sex marriage became a possibility only a month ago when Cuba's new Family Code - opening up everything from equal marriage to surrogate mothers - came into effect. The couple is one of the first to make the decision to get legally married in Cuba following the code. The code was approved after heavy campaigning by the Cuban government, and support by the most vocal

advocate for gay rights on the island, Mariela Castro, the daughter of former president Raul Castro.

"It's a big day," said Liusba Grajales, a manager at the Central University of Las Villas, 150 miles from Havana. "Love is love, just the way it is. Without imposition, without prejudice ... I don't know whether I should laugh or cry. It's a mix of so many strong emotions." Lisset Díaz, a 34-year-old dancer, shared her joy. "I feel proud. I'm amazed."

Together, they live with their two daughters, Laura, 11, and three-year-old Ainhoa who was born by insemination at home because at the time they had no access to assisted fertility treatments because they didn't have male partners.







