

NEW TOURISM ATTRACTIONS: BAJAN ENTERTAINMENT PARK?


"Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans." - Proverbs 16:3

In a recent MPE Caribbean Tourism Authority dispatch, I echoed the Florida-Caribbean Cruise Association's (FCCA) call to develop attractions and activities to respond to the influx of cruise visitors expected to the region this winter season and beyond.

We need to act immediately to present creative, customer-focused experiences for consideration by the cruise lines so their call is answered.

About a week ago, I visited a Ferris wheel in the outskirts of Dallas at my granddaughter Anya's request. The impressive Ferris wheel cabins seated six to eight adults comfortably.

After an engaging 20-minute ride of five revolutions of the wheel, which afforded panoramic views of the surrounding areas at differing heights



above ground, we were thoroughly satisfied with the experience and won-

dered off to enjoy the rest of the day.

My son Bevan suggested that Barbados could be a good Caribbean location for such an attraction.

My vision is to create an entertainment park centered around a Ferris wheel with many other attractions to lure tourists and residents alike.

The investment in an entertainment park is modest enough that Rihanna and Jason Holder, for example, successful Barbadian entertainers in the global music and cricket industry, respectively, could be approached to help drive investment in their island home.

However, there is no reason why the investment should be restricted to Barbadians. Other regional icons, local corporate investors, investors in the Diaspora and traditional foreign investors could be approached as our nation contemplates its future prosperity.

An innovative investment fund should be mounted to manage the risk of similar innovations.

Other prospects for the new entertainment park could include branding the facility with the names of super stars and showcasing the diversity of musical and cultural talent in the Caribbean. This facility can be promoted aggressively by the cruise industry long before the ship reaches the destination and concerts at the park could be scheduled to capture the thousands that disembark when the ship docks. Imagine the festive atmosphere!

A strategic visionary retreat should be mounted to flesh out the idea, a feasibility study commissioned, an entity "Rihanna's new entertainment park", say, established and then the investment portfolio activated.

Local "DNA of an Elephant" ideas should be invited, shepherds trained to support life coaching of the entrepreneurs involved as well as to engage them in business mentoring experiences to boost the profitability of the entity. Local value-added should be the name of the game, jobs will be created and solar energy will be the power source.

This facility will be state-of-the-art to reflect the mandate of excellence, and training will be predominant to take a leaf out of the Sandals corporation playbook.

The new park will continually renew itself with innovative intuitive projects to nurture its sustainability.

Maybe the crowning glory is to name the park after Rihanna, Jason Holder or another of our impressive young stars who are invested in the socioeconomic development of our nation.



NRA UPDATES COMMUNITY ON ONGOING PROJECTS

The National Roads Authority (NRA) are continuing their Capital Works programme across the island to improve Grand Cayman's roadway systems. The NRA have made significant progress on several major projects this year, including the Linford Pierson Highway expansion, East West Arterial construction, the Airport Connector Road (ACR) and the Crewe Rd and Hurley Merren Blvd widening.

The Linford Pierson Highway expansion is well underway with the new roundabout taking shape, along with the clearing and filling of the route connection to Outpost Street. Water

Authority are over 60% complete with installation of a new 12" water main along the road and

new drain wells have been installed. Subbase works along part of the westbound carriageway

have been completed, and curbing along that section will commence shortly. Caribbean Utilities Company (CUC) has been temporarily relocating poles and lines along this section, in preparation to install all underground infrastructure along this area starting in the first quarter of 2023. NRA costs for this will be approximately \$7M and it is on track to be completed by Summer 2023.

As of November 2022, segment one of the East West Arterial is 65% complete. This extension runs from Hirst Road to the Woodland Drive area, with the construction of a new roundabout at Hirst Road, pending settlement of key land claims in the area.

NRA is working closely with its selected consultant and the Environmental Assessment Board (EAB) to develop and finalize the draft Terms of Reference for the study which will assess several components deemed important by the EAB. The positive and negative impacts of the project on natural resources, cultural resources and socio-economic effects, including reduc-

tion in congestion and travel times, will all be identified and alternatives to mitigate these impacts will be assessed and evaluated. The public will be invited to review and discuss the draft Terms of References at community meetings to be held in early 2023. After finalizing the Terms of Reference, work on the EIA is anticipated to be completed in mid 2024 and construction of the road to the Bodden Town area will commence shortly after that.

The Airport Connector Road is a planned four-lane highway that provides a direct link between the Owen Roberts Airport

and the Esterley Tibbetts Highway. This is one of many efforts by the NRA to reduce road congestion and decrease commute times. This road will also be an

important connection for traffic in the

airport and industrial park area. Phase one extends from the Esterley Tibbetts Highway to Sparky Drive, accounting for approximately half of the two mile connector. Project expenses to date total just under \$4M and overall cost is estimated at \$10.2M.

The Shamrock Road and Hurley Merren Blvd widening project will see an upgrade from the CUC Roundabout (next to Kings Sports Centre) and Grand Harbour roundabout to include three lanes east-bound and three lanes westbound. This expansion will also feature bicycle lanes and road shoulders. With the segments between Grand Harbour Roundabout and Red Bay Roundabout now being almost complete, the NRA focus is now on widening both sides of the corridor between Grand Harbour Roundabout and the roundabout near Kings Sports Centre. Preliminary works have commenced on this

segment, including installation of drainage wells – continued works are pending the securing of wayleaves (permission) from property owners for the relocation of CUC poles on their properties.

The NRA thanks the public for their continued cooperation and caution on the roads during this time. Keep safe on the roads this holiday season. Wishing a happy and prosperous New Year to all, from our family at NRA to yours.



Clear masks option available for HSA hearing impaired patients

At HSA, we are constantly working towards improving our inclusivity and our patients' overall experience, which is why we've included this option of clear masks for those who need it."


Collection bins have now been placed for the public to drop off their natural Christmas trees in the following locations, from January 2 to 31, 2023:



Heroes Square was just the right venue for a great big Cayman style heroes' welcome home for Cayman' world FINA 50M freestyle world champion, Jordan Crooks on Wednesday 21 December.

Saturday 17 December will go down in the history books as the day that 20-year of Jordan beat swimmers from all around the world, including countries with populations a thousand times larger than the Cayman Islands at the FINA world championship in Melbourne, Australia.

Everyone was invited including VIPs Hon. Premier, Wayne Panton, H.E the Governor, Martyn Roper, Hon. Deputy Premier Chris Saunders, and Hon. Bernie Bush, Minister of Youth Sports, Culture and Heritage. But the really important people where his friend and family who had stuck by him, encouraged him and supported him.

Minister Bush said, Bernie Bush: "Thank you for joining me in welcoming our first ever world champion in the Cayman islands, 50 meter freestyle gold medal winner Jordan Crooks. This 20 year old Caymanian made history with his amazing race last Saturday at the 16th FINA World Championships in Melbourne Australia. Winning with a time of 20.46. We're here this evening to congratulate Jordan Crooks not only on this historic

achievement for the Cayman Islands, but on his endless dedication to the sport. Jordan swam a time of 20.36 in the prelims, breaking the Cayman Islands National Record by over a second, and becoming the fifth fastest all time swimmer in the 50m freestyle worldwide. We then watched the semi-finals with Crooks boasting an astonishing 20.31, and tying for the fourth overall on the all-time list, just 15 one-hundredths shy of the world record."

Minister Bush was visibly very proud of Jordan. He spoke about the Government's plans for a full-sized CIASA standard 50-meter pool, which would not only help provide Cayman's young swimmers the facilities they deserve, but would mean that Cayman could attract many international-level swim meets.

Premier Panton said that the Government had set up a share savings account for Jordan, and fund it, to the amount of 25,000 dollars: "That, we feel, is the only way for us to really and truly reflect the value of your achievement and the effort you have put in." During the evening Minister Bush and Premier Panton presented Jordan with a special award, in recognition of his achievement.

It was Mr. Carson Ebanks, Secretary General of the Olympic Committee who managed to put Jordan's remarkable achievement in perspective: "The world has a population of approximately eight billion people. A young and very talented Jordan Crooks from the Cayman Islands with a population of approximately 70,000, bravely faced the best swimmers in the world, and outswam them all, bar none," he said.

Mr. Steven Broadbelt, CIASA President, said, "I remember exactly where I was when he hit that wall, twenty and point 43 seconds. I was in a hotel room in Jamaica at a swim meet and I will never forget that moment, and the amount of pride that I felt, and the whole of the junior team that was over there

"He made the CARIFTA team five times. The first four times he didn't make an individual medal, but each time from 2014, he kept going back. And he'd make the finals, just an incremental every year...but not until his last year at CARIFTA did he score his medalsDon't give up. Look how long it took Jordan to get where he did. Look what he did, and follow his path."




