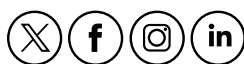

Ministry of Education (MOE) and Department of Education Services (DES) Announce Plans to Temporarily Relocate CIFEC for the Start of the 2024/2025 Academic Year

The Ministry of Education (MOE) and Department of Education Services (DES) today announced that the Cayman Islands Further Education Centre (CIFEC) will temporarily operate from an alternative site at the beginning of the 2024/2025 academic year due to unexpected delays in completing the renovations to the former George Hicks site.

CIFEC Director, Mr. Mark Seerattan, remarked: "We have been collaborating closely with the DES and the administrators of the Clifton Hunter and John Gray High Schools to finalise plans for the start of school, and will announce specific details shortly."

Mr. Seerattan further explained that the team has explored various solutions, including split-site arrangements and alternative ways to leverage available resources and spaces without compromising the quality of education.

DES Director Mr. Mark Ray noted, "We recognise the inconvenience and uncertainty this situation may cause for some of our students, parents and staff. However, we are committed to minimising disruptions while providing the best possible education for our students."

He further assured stakeholders that



the DES is in constant communication with the project team and will provide stakeholders with regular updates on the progress of the new facility. "We share your concerns, and are dedicated to addressing them promptly and effectively," he added.

With respect to registration, and induction for CIFEC students, these activities will commence on 28 August and 2 September, respectively. Specific dates for each student will be determined by

their surnames as outlined below.

Foundational Elements of a Just Constitution (Part Two)

In this series on the constitution and constitutional reform, I have been arguing that the discussion and analysis that precede constitutional reform should centre on personhood and evolve around foundational issues of citizenship, justice, democracy and context. In other words, a 'just' constitution will have as its foundation, firstly and most importantly, a proper conception of personhood which should then be used as a guide in framing issues of citizenship, democracy, justice and human rights, and the logic of context.

A Conception of Citizenship

A discussion of citizenship is critical in constitutional deliberations. The concept of citizenship, fully understood by an enlightened citizenry, and fully conveyed throughout the entire body politic, can be used as a tool of empowerment and as a check on the behavior and modus operandi of Government.

There is an intrinsic connection between the concept of citizenship and the nation-State during the last two hundred years. The notion of citizenship gained universal prominence with the idea of equal national status, developed and established by the French Revolution. The traditions, however, go back to pre-modern times. The city

or 'polis' in Greece replaced the familial and tribal bonds and entailed a new city-life, a new civic status, embracing the ethics of cooperation. Citizenship in the Greece was a distinct status which drew symbolic boundaries against those who lived without and within the physical space of the community but did not belong to it socially. Citizenship was originally a social construct, constitutive of the identity of a particular community, having status in a more abstract community, the polity.

Prominent sociologist Max Weber

notes that originally, citizenship was an exclusive social-political status, which had a distinct symbolic meaning and relevance. It meant membership in a republic. It was a status of equality and eminence, which distinguished a class of individuals who were recognized as having a particular stake, and particular rights, duties, and burdens in the polity. The original concept was based on republicanism. With the emergence of the modern state this idea was recast.

In the modern state, the concept of citizenship was based on the idea of democratic equality in which all are subject to the law. In the democratic framework, the citizen is granted equal rights to take part in the process of law-making. Citizenship describes the relationship between an individual and the state, with corresponding duties and rights; it implies a status of freedom with concomitant responsibilities. The citizen should restore, if necessary, but certainly live by fundamental values: becoming caring, just, and law-abiding, civil, but not servile, respectful, but not subservient. In this context, the constitution is the covenant between leaders and citizens. The constitution demands the existence of a partnership by setting out the responsibilities and accountabilities of political leadership, while clearly defining the rights, freedoms, and responsibilities of

the citizens.

A sharper understanding of what citizenship entails, and the kind of political leadership required to defend and deepen this kind of citizenship, should form a major part of constitutional discussion. Citizens are responsible for making democracy work. This is only possible when there is a broad-based understanding of the rights, privileges and responsibilities of the citizenry. The status of citizenship bestows upon individuals equal rights and duties, liberties and constraints, power and responsibilities. A reexamination of the roles of citizenry and leadership is imperative.

The attainment of universal adult suffrage in the Caribbean was extremely important in the process of democracy and nation-building. The vote was significant because of its possible effect on governance. It ensured self-determination, political participation, autonomy and representation. Political rights such as the right to vote and the right to hold political office are predicated upon citizenship. It is my view that in the Caribbean context, the notion of citizenship has not been fully developed throughout the entire political community. This underdeveloped sense of the meaning and significance of citizenship

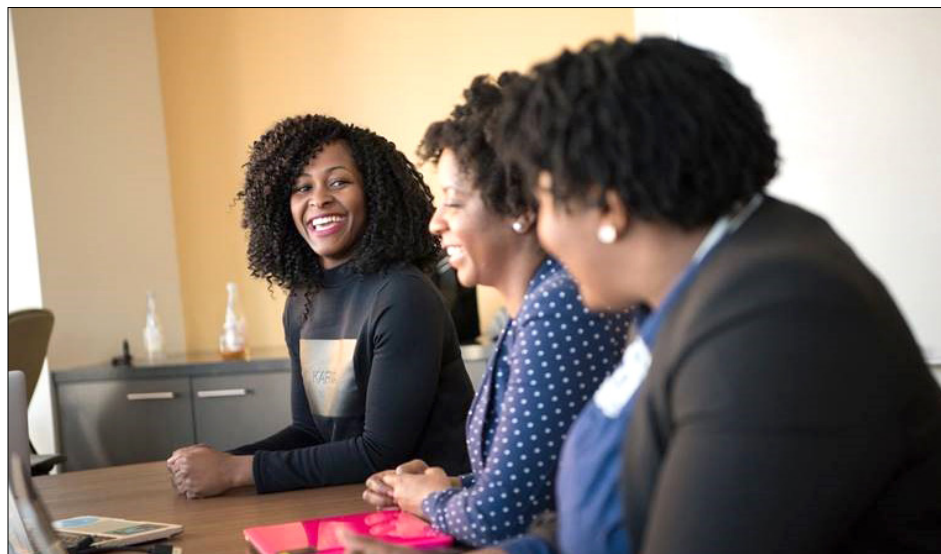
The week (18th to 22nd November 2024) will provide “inspirational” vocational training as a mediator and dispute resolution expert - and six free places are on offer as a gift to the island from the Bould Foundation. It is fully supported by leading lights in Grand Cayman, including the Deputy Premier the Hon. Hon. André Ebanks, MP, and will lead to long-term benefits, for both individuals and our community.

The course (which is available commercially for at CI\$ 1150) is led by the London-based international Faculty of the Society of Mediators and its award-winning expert CEO Jonathan Dingle FRSA. It will give delegates the most up-to-date skills in community, business, and relationship conflict resolution – along with advanced negotiation, deep listening, and mindfulness. In short, those who pass will have highly transportable knowledge and accreditation.

Mediation is a process of conflict resolution in which a trained neutral, called a mediator, helps two or more people in dispute to reach a mutually acceptable solution. The mediator (who often is not a lawyer) does not impose a solution - but helps create an effective conversation that allows people to explore possible solutions. Mediation is often used as an alternative to litigation or other more adversarial methods of resolving disputes, as it is much quicker, far less expensive, and non-confrontational, so very different to going to court. People involved in a dispute can either agree to mediate voluntarily or be ordered by a court or other authority to attend mediation. If people agree to mediate voluntarily, they can choose a mediator - and a time and location that suits everyone.

Mediation can be useful for a wide range of disputes, including in community, neighbour, and family disputes; workplace conflicts; contract disagreements; personal injury claims; and many more. It provides an opportunity for people to work together with a neutral mediator to find a mutually acceptable solution, rather than going through the often lengthy and expensive process of going to court. Mediation is a collaborative process that allows parties to communicate and negotiate effectively, and it can often (in more than 85% of cases) result in an effective, agreed, and usually more durable satisfactory outcome for everyone involved.

The week is hugely enjoyable and this



will be the tenth time since 2008 that it has been run in the Cayman Islands. The Faculty are very familiar with the community, business, and legal context and really enjoy offering their knowledge as part of a charitable outreach from the United Kingdom’s leading mediation training organisation.

The course has been described as “life changing” and well-known attorney and solicitor Toni Wildish called it “the best training I have ever done”.

“A golden opportunity” – Deputy Premier

The course and offer of free places thrilled the Hon. André Ebanks, MP, who fully supports this initiative and mentioned it to a few Caymanians who are legally qualified and looking for opportunities to bolster their qualifications and attractiveness in the legal job market.

The Deputy Premier, Minister for Financial Services & Commerce and Minister for Investment, Innovation & Social Development, called the chance for people to do the training for free “a golden innovative opportunity to progress and lay the foundations for a successful career in many walks of life; whilst showcasing the potential of the Cayman Islands Mediation and Arbitration Centre.”

“The course will change lives” – Director

Megan Paget-Brown, Director of the Cayman Islands Mediation and Arbitration Centre, said: “I am delighted that we are able to offer this course to the Island. Mediation is the future of dispute resolution in all jurisdictions – as well as in our community. The skills people acquire in the week will allow them to change their lives and professional outlook.”

is, undoubtedly, one explanation for the development and persistence of the im-

portant negative aspects of the political culture of Caribbean societies.

The Constitution lays down the “ground rules” for our living together in society and protects the possibility of a community in which individual citizens can live their full lives. Ideally, a conception of citizenship must evolve

out of a proper conception of personhood, democracy, and justice. It must be grounded in a normative or moral conception of persons, who are seen as basic units of thought, deliberation and responsibility. Democratic citizenship implies that citizens as free and equal persons with moral powers re-

garding the capacity for justice and for a conception of the good. This means that they have the powers of reasonable judgments, thoughts and inference. They have the capacity to form, revise, rationally pursue and deliberate as to the appropriate and just form of political rule for themselves and posterity.

Love for golden girls

St Lucia and Dominica are marking their first Olympic gold medals by celebrating the champion athletes who are raising their islands' awareness worldwide.

St Lucia's Hewanorra International Airport now has a giant poster of sprinter Julien Alfred who won the women's 100 metres and took silver in the 200m at the Paris Olympics earlier this month.

And a week after Grenada threw a huge party, motorcade and presentation of gifts for three medallists at the Paris Olympics, Dominica on Sunday did likewise for triple jumper Thea La Fond-Gadson whose gold was the first ever Olympic medal for the Emerald Island.

La Fond-Gadson, her husband and coach Aaron rode in a state vehicle and motorcade with other

family members from Portsmouth in the north to the capital Roseau as thousands of Dominicans lined the streets, waving flags and congratulating her.

La Fond-Gadson's achievement is being hailed worldwide but it is Alfred's two medals that are attracting the most attention. "We're so proud of Julien Alfred being the fastest woman in the world," Cuthbert 'Twatinay' Modeste, a St Lucian track and field coach who has trained Alfred since she was 11, told the BBC. "We can't wait to share our excitement and embrace anyone who is inspired to visit us because of Julien."

St Lucia has long been a popular destination for honeymooners through its tropical climate, lush rainforest and the towering twin Piton mountains. However, the Olympic success and a new album by Beyoncé protégé Chloe Bailey inspired by St Lucia is leading tourism officials to highlight that it is much more than sandy beaches, cruises and all-inclusive resorts.

In the days after Alfred's historic Olympic win, the island's official tourism board made her the face of its #LetHerInspireYou marketing campaign – so coined because St Lucia is the only sov-

ereign nation in the world named after a real-life woman. The catchphrase for visitors is to "explore St Lucia like an Olympian".

La Fond-Gadson needed crutches at the celebration because of recent surgery to a troublesome right knee that was painful well before the Games. Determined to compete, she said she worked through the pain barrier to get gold.

"The doctor said you can stop jumping for three months and

miss the Olympics. I did not cry. I realised we could manage. We persevered and we won. I will be fine in a couple months. I am one week post-surgery," she told a huge crowd to loud applause at an outdoor rally attended by Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrit and thousands of locals. She reminded the audience that she came close to medalling at the Tokyo Olympics three years ago but her leap was ruled as a foul.

Antigua crime soars so curfew is planned

Antigua and Barbuda has seen such an alarming spike in crime, particularly by gangs of youths, that Prime Minister Gaston Browne has announced plans to tackle the recent surge in gun-related robberies and violent incidents.

Browne said: "I assure you of my administration's unwavering commitment to take the fight to these criminal elements and to defeat them." He emphasised that the safety and well-being of the public are the government's highest priorities.

Addressing the concerns raised by the judiciary's sentencing practices, the Prime Minister urged for a realignment of the guidelines to reflect the gravity of gun crimes.

"We will at the next sitting of our Parliament enact increased penalties and

tighten the conditions of bail to keep these criminal elements off of our streets," he stated, adding that he has instructed the Attorney General to engage with the Acting Chief Justice on this pressing issue.

The government plans to increase police presence and provide better resources in appropriate places and also introduce anti-gang and juvenile curfew legislation to curb criminal behaviour involving minors and protect them from predators.

Alternative rehabilitation programs will also be implemented in penal institutions to reduce recidivism.

Browne added: "Fighting this scourge of crime and violence requires a national response with each citizen, each resident, taking full responsibility and playing his or her role in defeating these criminals."

Jamaica's new music mural is pitch perfect

Jamaica has a new tourist attraction on the north coast, a gigantic mural in tribute to some of its music heroes.

The mural in Catherine Hall is a 750-foot-long collaborative piece on Howard Cooke Street in Montego Bay painted by international and Jamaican artists. Begun six months ago, the mural features over forty reggae and dancehall icons including Bob Marley, Peter Tosh, Lee 'Scratch' Perry, Beenie Man, Yellowman and Garnett Silk.

The portraits are being painted on the

grounds of the waterfront music venue that every year hosts SumFest, Jamaica's largest and most prominent reggae concert, now in its 32nd year. It has now officially become known as the Reggae & Dancehall Wall of Fame.

Not yet complete, artists who have painted so far include Argentina's Maxi Bagnasco (one of the world's greatest portrait muralists), Lindz and Lamb from the US, Dasic Fernandez from Chile, Fernando Chamerele and Saulo Metria from Brazil and local Jamaicans Pamela Chang and Taoszen.

DEH Secures another Conviction in Court for Littering



The Department of Environmental Health (DEH) is issuing a reminder to the public about the serious implications of littering, which is an offense under the Litter Act (1997 Revision).

During the first week of May 2024, a resident from the West Bay area was found to have deposited and left litter on a property located on Conch Point Road, West Bay, belonging to Shoreline Development Company, without their consent. Under the Cayman Islands Litter Act Section (1997 Revision) 3 (1) which states "Whoever throws down, drops or otherwise deposits and leaves any litter in, into or from a public place in such circumstances as to cause, contribute to or tend to lead to its defacement by such litter is guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars or to imprisonment for six months." This irresponsible act was reported to the Department of Environmental Health (DEH), which promptly took action.

As a result of the investigation, the individual was charged and appeared in court on August 20, 2024, where he was fined \$300.00 for his littering offense. This case highlights the DEH's commitment to maintaining the cleanliness and

integrity of our environment, and serves as a warning to all residents and visitors alike.

"The hard work and dedication of our Environmental Health Officers in upholding the Acts regarding littering is commendable," said Richard Simms, Director of the DEH. "We take these matters seriously and will continue to prosecute anyone caught littering. Keeping the Cayman Islands clean is a shared responsibility, and we urge everyone to do their part."

There are five (5) other cases that are currently pending to be presented to the court by the DEH.

The DEH encourages the community to respect the environment by disposing of waste properly and reporting any instances of littering. Together, we can maintain the beautiful surroundings of our islands for everyone to enjoy.

Members of the public are encouraged to do their part in keeping the Cayman Islands clean and report any instances of littering and illegal dumping to the DEH at 949-6696, or via email to dehcustomerservice@gov.ky or click on <https://ow.ly/LTgE50Pz9xn>. Under the Litter Act (1997 Revision), convictions can result in \$500 fines, and/or six months imprisonment.

We appreciate being in the Cayman Islands and hope we can continue to build this partnership, working closely to assist those who might not be as strong in these important areas."

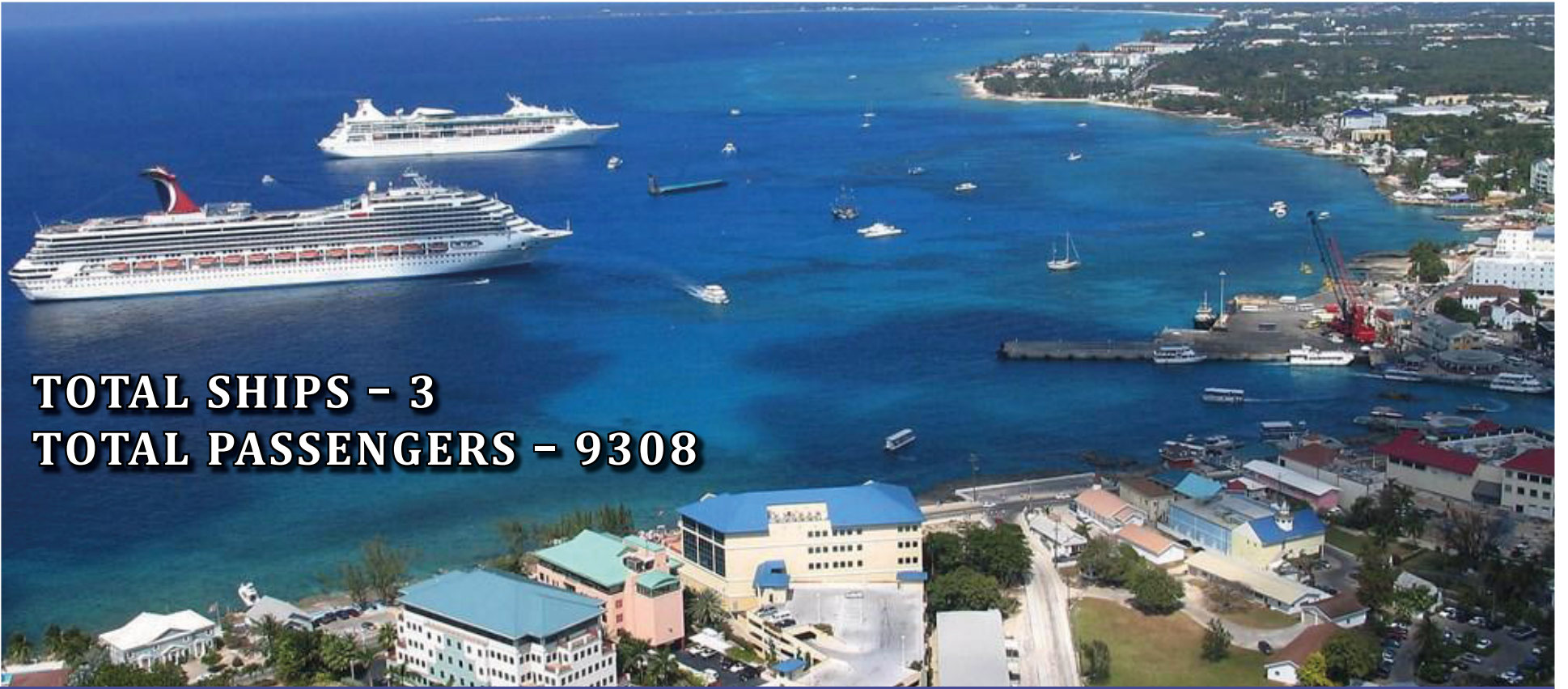
Alfred Robinson, a mosquito control leader from Turks and Caicos Islands, echoes this sentiment, saying, "The conditions in Cay-
