Springer Advocates for Tourism as a Driver of Peace and Prosperity


renew peaceful relations and unlock new regional opportunities," he suggests.



HSA Cardiology Department introduces advanced 3D echocardiography



The Cayman Islands Health Services Authority (HSA) announces the integration of advanced three-dimensional transthoracic echocardiography (3D-TTE) technology into its Cardiology Unit's Echocardiography Laboratory. This cutting-edge technology enhances the precision and depth of cardiac assessments, providing significant improvements over traditional two-dimensional echocardiography (2D-TTE).

Three-dimensional echocardiography offers detailed and accurate measurements of cardiac chamber size, function, and structure. Unlike 2D imaging, which can have limitations, 3D-TTE provides more precise measurements of the heart's chambers and how well they pump blood. This detailed information is crucial for making accurate diagnoses and planning the right treatment.

This advanced imaging technology is particularly valuable in evaluating both native and prosthetic heart valves, detecting congenital heart abnormalities, and guiding complex interventional procedures such as Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement (TAVR), MitraClip placement, and Implantable Cardioverter-Defibrillator (ICD) implantation.

The impact of the new 3D echocardiography technology has already been demonstrated through improved outcomes for patients like Jordan Stewart, a 14-year-old athlete who faced health challenges following a muscle tear and mild neurological symptoms. To ensure there were no underlying heart issues, Jordan underwent a comprehensive cardiac evaluation. While traditional 2D echocardiography suggested a possible issue with the wall separating the heart's upper chambers, the use of 3D echocardiography provided a clearer view, helping to avoid the need for a more invasive procedure. The 3D-TTE confirmed that Jordan had a small Persistent Foramen Ovale (PFO), a common condition that typically requires no treatment. Additionally, the advanced imaging allowed for a precise assessment of his heart function, which is particularly important for his performance as a competitive runner. With these findings, no further invasive tests were deemed necessary.

"Prior to testing, I was assured that this advanced technology would provide accurate results, and I felt comfortable knowing that his matter was being thoroughly investigated and that Jordan was being provided with the best care," stated Antonette McFarlane, Jordan's mother. "We are happy to have had the experience of this technology, and the results have alleviated our concerns. Jordan is excited to continue pursuing his passion for track and field."

Similarly, an 85-year-old patient, had been diagnosed with a severely narrowed aortic valve along with leakage in the mitral and tricuspid valves. Given her advanced age, a less invasive treatment approach was preferred to minimize surgical risks. The patient underwent Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement (TAVR) overseas, which successfully addressed her aortic valve issue. Although an attempt to correct the mitral valve leakage with a Mitral Clip was not successful, the use of 3D echocardiography played a crucial role in monitoring the changes in her heart valves and assessing the severity of the leakage. This detailed imaging enabled the medical team to choose the most ap-

propriate treatment options and timing for her interventions.

"I am very thankful that the HSA has this advanced technology available on the island. It is always better for us patients when our healthcare services continue to develop their technology because it lessens the need for us to travel overseas," the patient noted.

The HSA Cardiology Unit is now equipped with three state-of-the-art echo machines, including portable units with advanced features like speckle tracking. This technology is essential for detecting spotting early signs of heart issues that might not yet be causing symptoms and is particularly beneficial for patients undergoing chemotherapy, those with heart failure, and others with complex heart conditions

Each month, the department performs between 250 and 300 echocardiograms, utilising both exercise and pharmacological stress tests. The integration of 3D-TTE

into routine practice highlights HSA's commitment to providing the highest quality cardiac care.

HSA Cardiologist Dr Joanna Kregiel emphasises, "This technology improves patient outcomes through more accurate diagnostics and better-guided interventions, potentially reducing the need for invasive procedures. Our ability to serve a wide range of patients, from neonates to adults, both inpatient and outpatient, is greatly enhanced. The noninvasive nature of echocardiography, especially with 3D-TTE, offers a safer, more efficient diagnostic option."

Whether traditional 2D-TTE, advanced 3D-TTE, or slightly more invasive Transesophageal Echocardiography (TEE) is needed, patients at HSA can be assured of receiving the highest standard of cardiac care.

Cayman Islands National Robotics Team attends FIRST Global Challenge in Athens, Greece


The Cayman Islands National Robotics Team, comprised of students from seven local high schools, has headed to Athens, Greece to compete in the 2024 FIRST Global Challenge.

Under the theme "Feeding the Future," this year's event will be held from 26 to 30 September and will bring together students from more than 190 countries to learn about the importance of sustainable food production and sourcing. This topic is relevant to the team and the Cayman Islands as the country imports most of the food supply to support the local community.

Representing the Cayman Islands are Liam Benson of Cayman Prep & High School, Megha Cherayath of St. Ignatius Catholic School, Harry Cowell of Cayman International School, Garson Gardiner of John Gray High School, Jamie Johnson of Clifton Hunter High School, Abe Mohammed of Triple C School, Daeniell Pink of Triple C School and Aryan Ramsammy of Layman E. Scott Sr. High School in Cayman Brac. Accompanying the students are Glenda McTaggart – team manager, Desmond White – team coach and Nametha Abraham – team mentor.

Pink expressed her gratitude for being selected as a member of this year's team and competing in Athens, the birthplace of the modern Olympics.

"Being able to interact with other countries and being able to get to know their different perspectives on how they approach robotics is a great opportunity. I also think that the experience of the competition itself will be awesome and one of the only times in

will experience interacting with representatives from over 190 countries – it's very exciting to be a part of it," she said.

Team manager Glenda McTaggart said the experience of competing at the FIRST Global Challenge is one that the students will re-

member for a lifetime.

"Although it is a competition, the goal is not only about winning but being able to learn from the experience. Robotics teaches the value of teamwork, communication, time management, practice and the ability to perform under pressure," said McTaggart, who is also senior manager, education programmes at Dart.

In preparation for the FIRST Global Challenge, the team also benefitted from mentoring with prior national team members. Teejhan Hansraj, who competed as a member of 2022 Cayman Islands national robotics team, has been among those mentoring this year's members.

"I like giving back and helping prepare the team this year is rewarding. I'm able to share the experience I learned such as staying calm, thinking under pressure and communicating effectively with your team members. These insights give the team an edge because it's not something you see written on a piece of paper."

Speaking to the team at a recent farewell event, Deputy Premier and the minister responsible for innovation, André Ebanks, said: "The more that this type of activity (robotics) is recognised on island and becomes more baked into the (education) curriculum, the more you all will leapfrog to jobs of the future and you won't get stuck behind. It's a bonus, to then be able to promote the Cayman Islands on the world stage."

Ebanks added: "I am super excited for you all and I will be rooting for you because it will be an awesome experience. Show the world that innovation exists in the Cayman Islands and that we are one of the best."


In addition to this critical infrastructure issue, Cabinet has also granted its approval for the referendum to include





HURRICANE HELENE - A HORROR STORY WHICH JUST MISSED CAYMAN



A sigh of relief is rippling throughout Cayman as the community reflects on what might have been after escaping the early stages of what became Hurricane Helene

As the community remains on high alert during this peak of the hurricane season, preparations are being further intensified for another possible storm following in Helene's path.

All this is happening while repairs and recovery continue in the wake of the damage inflicted by flooding and storm surges from Helene.

But it was Florida which bore the brunt of the ferocity of Hurricane Helene which slammed into the state's northern gulf shore on Thursday in full Category 4 strength with winds of 140mph leaving a trail of death and destruction.

The storm also moved inland affecting Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia.

The rising death toll (around 70 people are known to have died up to press time) accompanied by damage already estimated in the billions of dollars is expected to get worse.

The US National Hurricane Center is also speaking of "catastrophic and historic flooding" in some areas caused by the passage and impact of Hurricane Helene.

Preliminary estimates put the total damage and economic loss from Helene at between \$95bn and \$110bn, according to AccuWeather.

Helene was the fourth hurricane to make landfall in the US this year.

The huge storm formed rapidly this week and strengthened as it careened



across the warm waters of the Gulf gathering speed.

According to the Guardian newspaper, climate scientists have warned that global heating is increasing the numbers and strengths of powerful hurricanes. While no individual storm is down to the climate crisis, the new pattern of more frequent and stronger hurricanes is powered by the planet's warming oceans and seas.

Much of Helene's power came from the strength it gathered over the Gulf of Mexico, which has reached unprecedented high temperatures in recent years.

Helene is forecast to be one of the largest storms in years to hit the region, Phil Klotzbach, a Colorado State University hurricane researcher, told the Associated Press. He said since 1988, only three Gulf

hurricanes were bigger than Helene's predicted size: 2017's Irma, 2005's Wilma and 1995's Opal.

Meanwhile, the Gulf of Mexico is now the hottest it's been in the modern record, according to Brian McNoldy, a climatologist at the University of Miami. "Taking a dip would feel like a bath: The average temperature of the surface is close to 90 degrees", according to recent measures of sea surface temperature.

"This is out of bounds from the kinds of variability that we've seen in [at least] the last 75 years or so," said Ben Kirtman, director of the Cooperative Institute for Marine and Atmospheric Studies, a joint initiative of the University of Miami and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA).

"That can be scary stuff," he warned.

CAYMAN BACK ON WEATHER ALERT

Residents of the Cayman Islands are urged to stay on high alert, especially for the next few days as the weather emergency caused by the development of what became deadly hurricane Helene, seems set for a replay.

Chief Meteorologist Kerry Powery reports that an area of concern near the Cayman Islands has been identified by the National Hurricane Center with a 50% chance of developing over the next seven days.

This system is similar to the origins of Hurricane Helene but is still developing, with potential rainfall of up to 4 inches for Grand Cayman and 2 inches for the Sister Islands.

Meanwhile, the Cayman Islands National Weather Service (NWS) and Hazard Management Cayman Islands (HMCI) are urging residents to remain vigilant as a new system continues to be monitored for further development, potentially near the Cayman Islands.

"A broad area of low pressure could develop near the Cayman Islands later this week. The system currently has a 0% chance of developing within the next two days and 70% chance within 7 days. A tropical depression could develop near the Cayman Islands later this week.," the NWS and HMCI said in a joint statement.

"At this stage, there is a lot of uncertain-

ty relating to the exact location and the general strengthening of this system. These factors will determine what impacts would be experienced by the Cayman Islands."

According to the two agencies, while noting its similarities to the genesis of Hurricane Helene, it is important to note that some environmental factors are different, and these affect the general forecast of the system.

Models are indicating up to 4 inches of rain between October 2 and 3.

With the ground already saturated from Helene and tides expected to be elevated this week, this poses some concerns in

terms of potential flooding with this system.

There is the potential for strong winds across the Cayman Islands, which would result in rough seas, especially in and around showers. A small craft advisory is in effect for Wednesday and Thursday, October 2nd and 3rd.

The NWS and HMCI are advising that in preparation for what may be ahead, residents should check their hurricane preparedness kits and secure their homes, particularly against flooding in low-lying areas.

Additionally, in the eventuality of strong winds, homeowners and tenants are encouraged to make the necessary arrangements to secure dwellings and property.

Residents are also reminded to stay tuned to official updates from NWS, HMCI, and Radio Cayman for the latest information as this weather system develops.

The US National Hurricane Center(NHC) reports that it is watching for potential tropical development in the same region where Hurricane Helene formed earlier this week. "An area of low pressure could

begin to organize in the region early this week before moving slowly into the Gulf of Mexico, where additional development is possible."

A tropical depression could form around midweek while the system tracks northwestward. The system is expected to move into the Gulf during the latter part of the week.

Authorities in the Cayman Islands continue to monitor the system and are urging residents to stay on high alert and take the necessary precautions.

Cayman set to resume Concacaf **Nations League play**

The Cayman Islands is set to resume Concacaf Nations League play next month with an eye on advancing through to the CNL Play-In as the Confederation released the tournament's October schedule.

Cayman will face British Virgin Islands on Saturday, 12 Oct. before concluding Group Stage play by taking on St. Kitts and Nevis on Tuesday, 15 Oct. Both matches are slated to begin at 2:30 p.m. at Warner Park Football Stadium, in Basseterre, St. Kitts and Nevis.

"We are excited to get back on the pitch," Cayman Islands Head Coach Joey Jap Tjong said. "We learned a lot from our first two matches of the tournament and look forward to another opportunity to get better and show what we can do."

Cayman currently sits in second place in Group C with three points. The three group winners and the best second-place finisher will advance to the CNL Play-In. Over in Group B, second-place Anguilla is the only other League C team with three points.

"We just need to focus on the next match and playing our best for 90 minutes," Jap Tjong said. "If we implement in the match what we work on in training and if we play with energy and play for one another, I'm confident the results will be positive."

Cayman opened CNL play with a 1-0 win over BVI courtesy of a left-footed winner from Elijah Seymour before dropping a 4-1 decision to St. Kitts and Nevis. Captain Mason Duval scored the loan goal for Cayman in the loss.

The team has now won two of its last four matches dating back to June, including a 1-0 win over Antigua & Barbuda in World Cup qualifying.

"We're a young team and we're building momentum," Jap Tjong said. "It's great to see. The players are coming together."

The fourth edition of the CNL kicked off in September with matches across all three Leagues (A, B, and C). Highlights included Seymour scoring the compe-



tition's 1,000th goal. The match results and standings are available

A total of 37 CNL matches will be played next month (9-15 Oct.), concluding Group Stage play for Leagues A and C, while League B will play through November. The CNL Play-In will take place during the FIFA Match Window of November. It will consist of a single direct elimination round and eight teams: the fifth and sixth-place finishers from the League A Groups and the group winners and the best second-place finisher from League C.
