



Joey Hew Appointed as Leader of the Opposition, signaling a New Era of Leadership for Cayman

Hon. Joseph "Joey" Hew was officially sworn in today as Leader of the Opposition by Governor Jane Owen. He succeeds Hon. Roy McTaggart, who served as Leader of the Opposition since April 2021. Hew's ascension is expected to be followed by his appointment as Leader of the People's Progressive Movement (PPM) at their upcoming conference in January 2025. This transition marks a critical step in the leadership evolution of the PPM, as the party continues its mission to build a future of stability, opportunity, and unity with Hew at the helm.

Joey Hew: A Proven Leader for a New Era

Joey Hew has served as Member of Parliament for George Town North since 2013 and has been a dedicated leader within both the public and private sectors. His leadership includes roles such as Parliamentary Secretary for the Ministry of District Administration, Tourism, and Transport and Minister for Commerce, Planning, and Infrastructure in 2017. He was also elected Deputy Political Leader of the PPM in March 2021 and has served as Deputy Leader of the Opposition since the 2021 Election. His experience in business as Managing Director and Chief Operating Officer of his family's group of companies, combined with his former leadership roles in the Chamber of Com-

In his first remarks as Leader of the Opposition, Hew stated, "Mr. Speaker, Cayman is at a turning point. We must ensure that economic stability translates into real progress for every Caymanian. My leadership will be about more than just managing challenges and holding the government accountable; it will be about proposing and delivering workable solutions to shape the future of our island while ensuring no one is left behind and that

everyone can participate and benefit from our progress." In closing, Hew declared his commitment to Cayman's future stating, "We are ready to fight for a Cayman where every citizen feels the benefits of progress, where every family has hope for a better future and I will not rest until that vision is realised."

Roy McTaggart's Legacy of Fiscal Responsibility and Social Advocacy

Roy McTaggart's legacy as leader of the opposition included significant contributions in governance, social issues, and

economic policies. McTaggart was very vocal about the need for fiscal responsibility and sustainable economic growth. He actively advocated for vulnerable groups, including seafarers and veterans, and was instrumental in securing a stipend boost for these communities in June 2023, reflecting his dedication to social issues. McTaggart also pressed for stronger action on crime and public safety, calling for more proactive approaches to law enforcement.

If you want to sample the very best street food from around the world – the best way is surely Cayman's Street Food Festival.

Smokies are well-known Known for their delicious smoked meats and BBQ dishes. Their menu features a variety of smoked meats, including pulled pork, brisket, and ribs, often accompanied by classic sides




Taking our Constitution Seriously: A Conception of the Just Constitution (Part Five)

In this series on the constitution and constitutional reform, I have been arguing that the discussion and analysis that precede constitutional reform should centre on personhood and evolve around foundational issues of citizenship, justice, human rights, democracy and context. In other words, a 'just' constitution will have as its foundation, firstly and most importantly, a proper conception of personhood which should then be used as a guide in framing issues of citizenship, democracy, justice and human rights, and the logic of context.

For a constitution to have moral authority it must be, in the principles it advances, grounded in a proper conception of personhood. It must have legitimacy through widespread support that is democratically ratified. It also needs moral justification, that is, it must espouse independent normative political truths and do so on the premise that all are worthy of equal moral and political regard.

The just constitution allows for the establishment of basic political and social institutions which are appropriate to realizing the values of liberty and equality of citizens. In modern constitutional thought, the principle of separation of powers is an indispensable basis of the constitution of a country that would fulfil its genuine task of the realization of the

rights and the protection of the freedom of its citizens. A just constitution places fundamental rights completely beyond the reach of democratic politics. This means that fundamental rights are protected against normal political change. This is crucial.

The constitution must settle constitutional essentials, such as the general structure of government and the political process, the powers of the legislature Executive, and Judiciary, the scope of majority rule, as well as the basic equal rights and liberties of citizenship that legislative majorities are to respect. Reform of a constitution must proceed only as experience shows that changes are required to ensure political justice for the general

The central argument being developed in this "idealistic" framework is that a just constitution must be anchored in a proper conception of personhood. I have argued that the Anglophone Caribbean, though steeped in the Christian tradition, does not draw enough from the positive aspects of the Christian concept of personhood. For example, Christianity endows the individual human being with a high level of importance and sacredness. The biblical narrative asserts that the human being is neither a cosmic accident nor an evolutionary paradigm. In fact, the image-of-God motif, so central to the Genesis account, is possibly the most powerful expression of the dignity and uniqueness of mankind.

Abstracting from the Christian perspective, the citizen - the human being - created in God's image must be viewed as rational, with the capacity for morality and with guaranteed rights of civility, decency, respect, and freedom. Our society and its constructs need to be grounded in a proper concept of persons as having the capacity to make individual

choices and to identify what is meaningful for their lives. The person, then, an emotional, psychic, and social creature, should be treated as an end in himself and not merely as means. For example, the duty to respect others is grounded in the value of their humanity. From this premise will flow institutional and social arrangements which can be deemed to be just and fair.

The argument has been developed that a just constitution is one which has as its philosophical base a proper conception of the human person. However, for a constitution to have salience, relevance, and longevity, considerations of context are critical. A constitution must be relevant to the historical, politico-economic, and socio-cultural milieu of the society. The process of constitutional engineering or reform must be sensitive to the peculiarities of that society. Even when modifications or transplants are made, they must be seen as capable of fitting into the context of the society and capable, too, of being instruments of transformation. The process must be bold enough to subject the present framework, to intense scrutiny, but must avoid like the plaque blindly importing constitutions without proper examination, with a view to shaping them to suit the country's present and future needs. In the end, whether a Constitution is good or bad depends upon its suitabili-

the Cayman Islands (2.8%), and the composition of the labour force, especially the profile of Caymanians compared to non-Caymanians and persons holding holding Permanent Resident - With Right to Work status. It also details the overall population demographics relative to the labour force.

The ESO report shows that Cayman's unemployment rate is a low 2.8 per cent, second only to Bermuda (2.5 per cent). Elsewhere throughout the Caribbean the unemployment rate runs from around 4 per cent in the British Virgin Islands, to 9 per cent in the Bahamas, with Barbados, Jamaica and other countries between - except for Haiti where the unemployment rate is estimated to be in high double digits compounded by extremely low wages.

"The unemployed labour force had a count of 1,740, yielding an unemployment rate of 2.8 per cent. Additionally, the count of unemployed Caymanians reached 1,142 individuals, contributing to an unemployment rate of 4.9 percent," the ESO reported

It also shows that the unemployed labour force mainly consisted of persons aged 25 to 34 (436 persons), accounting for 25.1 per cent of the total unemployed.

In terms of sex, a higher percentage of females (54.3%) were unemployed than males (45.7%).

Underemployment

"A breakdown by status showed that Caymanians had an underemployment rate of 2.9 per cent, whereas Permanent Residents WRW and Non-Caymanians had rates of 2.3 per cent and 1.1 per cent, respectively. The highest rates of underemployment were observed among individuals aged 15 to 24 (4.5%) and those

with primary and below education levels (3.7%), followed by those aged 55 to 64 (2.9%)."

According to the ESO report a total of 22,181 Caymanians accounted for 36.4 percent of the employed labour force. NonCaymanians and PR-WRW(Permanent Resident - With Right to Work) accounted for 54.3 per cent and 9.3 per cent of the employed labour force respectively.

Employment Status

Most of the employed labour force (91.6%) "worked for someone". Self-employed persons, including business owners with and without employees, accounted for 8.1 percent of the employed labour force. Among employed males, 11.3 percent were self-employed compared to 4.6 percent among females. Furthermore, Caymanians (16.7%) were most likely to own a business In comparison to Permanent Residents WRW (12.8%) and Non-Caymanians (1.5%).

Occupation

The top five occupations, accounting for 77.5 per cent of total employment, were professionals (19.7%), service and sales workers (18.2%), elementary occupations (13.7%), craft and related trades workers (13.2%), and managers (12.7%)

Industry

The ESO findings shown that the top six industries accounted for 55.5 percent of the employed labour force. These industries were: construction (12.3%); wholesale and retail trade (10.9%); professional, scientific, and technical activities (10.0%); financial and insurance activities (7.7%); restaurants and mobile food services activities (7.4%) and activities of households as employers (7.2%).



Earnings from Main Job

Around 51.8 percent of employed individuals earned CI\$2,400 or more per month.

The proportion was higher among employed males (55.7%) than employed females (47.4%). A higher proportion of Caymanians (62.5%) earned CI\$2,400 or more per month compared to Permanent Residents WRW (60.3%) and Non-Caymanians (43.1%).

Population

The population of the Cayman Islands was estimated at 87,866, the ESO report stated. This consists of 39,897 Caymanians, 7,822 Permanent Residents (including 6,288 WRW), and 40,147 non-Cayma-

nians.

Among them, 62,743 individuals comprised the labour force, with 61,003 employed and 1,740 unemployed. These findings result in an overall labour force participation rate of 83.6 percent, which varied by sex and status. The unemployment rate stood at 2.8 per cent, varying by status and sex.

"Non-Caymanians made up the largest proportion of the population, accounting for 45.7 per cent, while Caymanians and Permanent Residents had a population share of 45.4 and 8.9 per cent, respective-

According to the ESO, compared to Spring 2023, the Caymanian population increased by 2.5 per cent.

Cabinet approves historic Climate Change Policy 2024-2050 setting the Cayman Islands on a 26-year strategic road to climate-resiliency

For the first time, a national Climate Change Policy (CCP) has been approved for the Cayman Islands. The CCP, presented by the Hon. Katherine Ebanks-Wilks, Minister for Sustainability & Climate Resiliency, was approved by Cabinet on Wednesday 25 September.

The Policy outlines a 26-year plan for adaptation and mitigation that aims to bring to life the Policy's vision of a climate-resilient Cayman Islands that promotes and sustains vibrant communities, a thriving natural environment and a robust economy.

The Policy has three core goals for the country and the government:

- 1. Become more resilient to climate change
- 2. Achieve a low-carbon economy
- 3. Govern climate action fairly and transparently with future generations in mind

These goals are underpinned by six focus areas that are essential pillars to the success of the policy:

- **1. Robust economy:** Diversifying economic sectors and providing access to financial and technical resources to foster sustainable livelihoods.
- **2. Liveable built environment:** Planning holistically and building climate-resilient structures and sites to safeguard citizens, businesses and cultural heritage.
- **3. Healthy and resilient communities:** Improving the health and safety outcomes of communities.
- **4. Resilient infrastructure networks:** Enhancing the capacity and functionality of critical infrastructure and its networks to withstand extreme weather events.
- **5. Harmony with nature:** Safeguarding the integrity of nature and its ecosystem services to support a robust economy and healthy communities.
- **6. Integration and coordination:** Developing government processes and capacity to take urgent climate action.

The Honourable Katherine Ebanks-Wilks, Minister for Sustainability & Climate Resiliency, said: "I am delighted to see this historic Policy approved by Cabinet. This is the first time that a Climate Change Policy has been approved for the Cayman Islands, and is the result of two years of work and multi-stakeholder engagement carried out by the MSCR Policy Team and the Technical Working Group. The Policy is bolstered by fresh insights and circumstances that were identified in the Cayman Islands Climate Change Risk Assessment 2022, taking into further consideration the needs of the most vulnerable in our society such as children, the elderly, disabled, and the economically disadvantaged, and also implications for the Financial Services Sector.

"As a nation we have recently experienced Hurricane Beryl, and witnessed the utter devastation she wrought upon parts of the US. We've seen flooding and coastal erosion continue to pose serious risks to homes and businesses in the Cayman Islands, and we know that increas-

ingly warmer ocean waters contribute to the strength and intensity of hurricanes in our region. While we cannot prevent these severe weather events, this policy enables us to take proactive steps to safeguard and support our people, environment and economy.

"The approval of this Policy is testament to the incredible dedication of the Ministry and its policy advisors. It is also important to note, however, that this policy is a strategic pathway for a more climate-resilient future for the benefit of us all, and the key to success is in collaboration.

"The Climate Change Policy provides a governance framework for climate action which includes cooperation and coordination across ministries and departments, the private and public sectors and civil society, and I look forward to seeing this policy make a real and positive change in the future outlook for all three Cayman Islands."

The CCP, builds on previous climate-resiliency policies, notably the draft Cayman Islands' Climate Change Policy 2011.

Cabinet's approval of the CCP 2024-2050 enables the Ministry of Sustainability & Climate Resiliency to start developing an implementation plan which will involve consultation with internal and external stakeholders.

The CCP sets out clear timeframes and strategic actions which will move the country towards the Policy's goals, and states 23 "quick-wins" that have been identified as short-term actions (deliverable between 2024 and 2030) that will build momentum toward the Policy's vision. The quick wins include identifying climate-related financial opportunities and vulnerabilities, completing the Coastal Setback Reference Line reassessment and implementing a National Sargassum Management Strategy, to name a few. The Policy will be reviewed every two years.

The Policy is largely guided by the Climate Change Risk Assessment (CCRA) which was conducted in 2022. Funded through the Governor's Office by the United Kingdom's Conflict, Stability and Security Fund, and following extensive desktop research, technical stakeholder consultation and public engagement, the resulting Cayman Islands Climate Change Evidence Report (2022) is now the most comprehensive reference document to date on the potential implications of climate change on the Cayman Island's environment, society and economy.

Lisa Hurlston-McKenzie, Senior Policy Advisor - Climate Resiliency, Ministry of Sustainability & Climate Resiliency, said: "The Climate Change Policy 2024-2050 is a missiondriven and evidence-based policy that provides a clear strategic pathway to address the most pressing risks posed by current and continued climate change factors. The Policy's strategies have been crafted to reduce the impacts of extreme weather events on households and communities in the short and longer term. Work on an implementation plan with government and non-government partners to bring about these, and other benefits, will begin immediately."

Acting Chief Officer, Troy Jacob, Ministry of Sustainability & Climate Resiliency, said: "I would like to thank the Minister for her guidance and determination, the team within the Ministry, and our colleagues from other ministries, departments and government agencies for consulting on this updated Policy. Indeed, it is a notable achievement for this Ministry, being new and small, to have delivered two approved national policies within this administration – the Updated National Energy Policy which was approved earlier this year, and now the CCP. The Ministry looks forward to working closely with government, private sector and non-governmental partners, for the implementation of both national policies."

RCIPS Provides Update on Operation Clyro and Reminds the Public to be Safe on the Roads

The third phase of Operation Clyro is now well under way and the police continue to encourage all road users to be safe and make good choices while driving.

Operation Clyro, a road safety initiative that forms part of the National Road Safety Strategy which is aimed at 'Safe Roads, Safe Cayman: The Road to Zero', began on Monday 30th September and will continue to 14th October. The operation will ensure a greater presence of traffic officers on the road way, and the intention is to highlight and curb poor driving behaviour through education and enforcement, targeting offense such

as speeding, DUI, inconsiderate driving and distracted driving.

Since the start of the campaign, more than 220 persons have been prosecuted for various traffic offenses. Of these just under 50 were issued for speeding and approximately 4 of those were issued to heavy equipment vehicles exceeding the speed limits, often carrying excessive loads. Approximately 95 tickets were issued to drivers of unlicensed vehicles.

Also, throughout the period, more than 43 motor vehicle collisions were reported to the police, one person was arrested on suspicion of DUI and two persons were

warned for intended prosecution for careless driving.

As we approach the weekend and with all the social activities taking place, the RCIPS would like to remind the public that Operation Clyro is ongoing and that there will be a significant police presence on our roadways. We encourage everyone to drive safely and with courtesy, ensure that you do not drink and drive, but instead have a plan on getting home safely if you have been consuming alcohol, and reduce your speeds on the roadway, especially in areas with high pedestrian traffic and in adverse weather.



Police Investigate Juveniles Experiencing Suspicious Medical Issues

Shortly after 7:45PM, on Monday 7 October, police responded to a residential address in East End, where a juvenile was found unresponsive.
