

## Pirates Week gets big cash injection

Ensuring that Pirate's Week was a rip-roaring success this year, Dwayne Seymour, Minister for Border Control, Labour & Culture, outlined at a press conference last Wednesday that government had allocated \$574,000 to the weeklong event and an entire steering committee was working hard to make sure it was a success.

This year's theme would be Setting Sail through Time and would be including several new features not seen in previous in Pirate's Week festivals, including a drone show and some headlining music acts, including Fab 5 Inc, a band from Jamaica and Soca sensation Bunji Garlin.

Minister Seymour said one of the most beloved features of Pirates Week had traditionally been the District Days and they would be back, giving each district the chance to celebrate its unique culture.

The District Days would begin on Monday 11th November at George Town, then North Side on 12th November, followed by East End on 13th, West Bay on 14th, Bodden Town on 15th, Little Cayman on 23rd and Cayman Brac would be closing the District Days on 30th November.

The Minister said to expect music, food

and crafts all to add a local flavour to the celebrations, bringing the vibrance of culture to the forefront.

Highlights of the weeklong event would include a drone show followed by a live concert on 9th November featuring Fab 5 Inc and Swanky Kitchen Band. On 16th November, there would be a firework finale followed by a fete featuring Bunji Garlin.

There would be a Family Fun Day on the 10th November at The Cayman Turtle Centre and children 12 and under who come dressed as pirates would get free entry. The Minister said as this was the 25th anniversary of the Cayman National Cultural Foundation's Gimistory cultural festival, this event would be woven into proceedings as a key feature of the District Days, enhancing the cultural richness of the celebrations. Artist Nasaria Suckoo Chollette, Horacio Esteban and cultural pioneer Henry Muttoo would also feature in the celebrations.

The grand float parade would speak to the theme of celebrating maritime history and heritage, he advised.

The funding of \$574,000 would go towards funding heritage days, secure local and international artists and setting up stages and firework displays, he said.

"The budget allocation allows us to create a celebration that not only boosts our economy by attracting visitors but also reinforces our local pride and gives our people a platform to showcase our rich culture and traditions," he said.

Patrice Beersingh, Pirates Week Chair and Festival Director, said that Pirates Week was so much more than just a celebration of pirate folk law, it was a celebration of culture and maritime history.

Ms Beersingh outlined further events to look out for, including a Pirates Week bar crawl, enabling them to partner with all bars to support local establishments with shuttle buses running continuously. Expect live music and drink specials. There would also be a Mike Lockwood

swim meet, the ever-popular cardboard boat race, the iconic pirates landing in the George Town harbour, a 5k Dave Martins honouring the cultural icon with proceeds going to the One-to-one charity (formerly BBBS) and a turtle release.


Ms Beersingh said the festival would give Cayman the chance to honouring the past while chartering a course for the future

Ambassador for Culture Miss Universe Cayman Reagan Rutty said:

"Pirates Week is an extraordinary opportunity for our culture history and heritage to shine brightly in the spotlight. This is our moment to showcase to residents, visitors and the world the unique offerings that set us apart from the rest of the Caribbean."

She continued: "This year's theme Setting Sail through Time evokes a sense of nostalgia and offers us a chance to engage in traditional crafts and activities. The art of rope making, for example, is not just a craft, it symbolises our resilience and ability to adapt through generations," she said, calling 'Gimistory' "a beautiful bridge" connecting gens where young and old could come together captivated by Cayman stories.

Organisers say there is still spaces for vendors, with a deadline of 25th October.

## Progressives kick off election campaign with Meet & Greet at Constitution Hall

The official beginning of the People's Progressive Movement (PPM)'s election campaign kicked off on Monday 13 October at Constitution Hall. It was billed as a Meet & Greet session, where PPM members including Former Premier Sir Alden McLaughlin, and the new PPM leader, Joey Hew, along with Deputy Leader Barbara Conolly got to mix and mingle with the folk who had braved the sudden downpour of rain to come and find out what the PPM were bringing to the table.

Sir Alden began by fully endorsing the PPM's fourth leader: "He's not as young as he looks, but he has a wealth of experience. He was President of the Chamber of Commerce and President of the Rotary Club. I think he's more than qualified to take up the leadership, and he has the backing of the rest of us. He has the full support of all of us who are elected. No one is challenging him for the leadership, and no one is challenging Barbara," he said.

"I think the country, Even the greatest supporters of the current government and the biggest naysayers of the Progressives must realise by now that this business of electing a bunch of Independents from each constituency who have no common purpose, no common set of policies and programmes with no common agenda is a recipe for bad government.

"They are not making much progress because they cannot agree on many things. People ask me, 'How is it that Parliament meets as it just did, and they don't even have one Bill?' It's because they can't agree on any one thing. That's why no work is coming through the Caucus, the Cabinet and the House.

Joey Hew said:

"We still live in the best country in the world. How can we enjoy our country a bit more? How do we address some of your concerns about things that are not letting you sleep at night and not allowing you to enjoy this beautiful country that we have? Health insurance?

"Why are we back to where Caymanian school-age children aren't receiving free care at the hospital? Even if we have to do a means-test. We only have to do it twice, at the admission to primary school, and then again when they go to High School,

"Let me tell you a story about a young lady working in a supermarket for eight dollars an hour. She's trying her best, she has two children, she's on NAU. Then she has to get an advance for her uniform and has to pay that back. Then she has to get a babysitter...then pension and insurance has to be taken out. We sat down and worked it out for her – she was losing fifty dollars a week. It made no sense for her to

go to work.

"Making the lives of our citizens better, helping them to enjoy this beautiful country. How difficult is that? No, (they) want to go and build big grand things that have nothing to do with the lives of our people. That is not me. I want to see my people happy. That is what I'm about – seeing other people thrive.

"So this is what we're talking about – bring-

ing back the focus onto our people - being real, touching hands, being part of the community – listening to you. This is what we are going to talk about when we are talking about going out there to fight for our young people.

"Because unless you have wealthy parents that can put up the deposit for you to buy a home, you will never buy a home. So we have to put programmes in place. We had a multi-agency task force set up before Covid hit. There are programmes such as shared ownership where the government buys a home, and you buy a percentage from the government – say 30 per cent. Then each year you can buy a little



more until you get to 50%. And then you can cash it in and go and buy somewhere else – then you can sell it back into the programme, and then another Caymanian can come and buy a percentage."

Barbara Conolly, the first woman to serve as Deputy Leader of the Opposition, underscored the significance of this moment for Cayman. "It's a Proud moment for the women of the Cayman Islands," she

## Circus International comes to town!

Ms DeBor gave some background to the show:

"We chose the Lions Centre for its size as we are bringing a full-scale circus show with international artists from all over the world. We have an incredible wire walker from Cirque du Soleil named Stéphane Pansa as well as one of the most famous juggling troupes on the planet: the Arestov family," she advised. a

In addition, aerialists from Big Apple Circus are included in the cast, as well as performers from the America's Got Talent TV show.

"Aerial acts will happen up to 35 feet in the air, the ceiling was high enough and riggable at the Lions Centre (and they have been a pleasure to work with)," she confirmed. "The finale of the show is an incredible trampoline wall act, there was enough space to fit it in, so we are excited to bring that as well."

There will be no animals involved in the circus performances, Ms DeBor said.

The whole event is designed to bring a full-scale circus to Grand Cayman, create a safe and fun environment for families to spend time together, and benefit an incredible cause, she added. There will be the usual treats on offer, such as cotton candy, hot dogs, popcorn, and snow cones.

In total, there will be seven shows, each show will be an hour and a half long with a 15 minute intermission, including activities such as face painting, and opportunities to meet the cast. Aerialists, acrobats, high flying stuntman, comedy, and live music are included in each show.

Showtimes are as follows: Thursday, October 17th at 4:30 PM and 7:30 PM, and Friday, October 18th will feature shows at 4:30 PM and 7:30 PM. On Saturday, October 19th they will have showtimes at 1:00 PM, 4:00 PM, and 7:00 PM.

# Veterans Association launch poppy appeal at fundraising gala

The Cayman Islands Veterans Association put on their 11TH annual fundraising Gala

at the Marriott Hotel on Saturday 12 October.

In attendance were Her Excellency the Governor, Jane Owen, and Deputy Premier Andre Ebanks. All the Cayman Islands Veterans' Association members were there as well, along with contingents from Caymans Uniformed Services, including the RCIPS, the Cayman Islands Regiment, the Coast Guards, and Cadet Corps.

When everyone was seated at their tables there was the Pinning of the First Poppy on Governor Jane Owen, by Veterans' Association Member Shadden McLaughlin. President of the Association, Andrew McLaughlin, was in charge of giving out fines to attendees, and one of the fines included having a poppy before the first poppy pinned on the Governor.

The event heralded the official beginning of the poppy appeal, one of the fundraising activities for the Veterans. Along with the poppy appeal, the gala itself is a major fundraiser, with many 'fines' for 'Mess Room

infractions." There were also sales of raffle tickets and many wonderful prizes including Cayman Airways tickets.

Shadden McLaughlin told her own story of wanting to join the Military from a young age, after witnessing Operation Desert Storm, and having a Captain of the United States Marine Corps as a penpal. "Right after High School when I was 18 years old I shipped off to Paris Islands South Carolina. My Father tried to tell me I did the wrong thing," she said.

During the evening there was the symbolic laying of an empty table, and lighting of a candle to represent the members of the armed forces who had sadly passed away. Each item on the table had a different symbolic meaning.

The guest speaker was Honorary Colonel of the Cayman Islands Regiment Mark Lancaster, who also holds the title of Lord Lancaster of Kimbolton.

"One of my ministerial jobs in the UK was to be the Veteran's Minister which I was for three years between 2012 and 2015 and I can say without doubt it was the greatest job," he said. "The opportunity to serve with our men and women who had served around the world. You've seen tonight some of the challenges that they face, not only leaving families but the families themselves, yet they have continued to do that. I experienced it myself when the British army was campaigning around the world, and there is no greater feeling than coming home from an operation abroad and seeing your family."

"I stand before you tonight as the Honorary Colonel of the Cayman Islands Regiment, and tonight is a very significant date – it is exactly five years to the day that the government announced the creation of the Cayman

Islands regiment."

Lancaster told the story of how the Cayman Islands Regiment got started.

"The other job I did in government after being Veteran's minister was Minister of the Armed Forces. I was in London in C.O.B.R.A - Cabinet Office Briefing Room A, where we manage all of our disasters. When Hurricane Irma hit the BVI in 2017. I remember being halfway around the world listening to the challenges that BVI had faced, The UK was in the region but was criticized for not doing enough. I was one of many who vowed we would not be in that position again.

"The following summer we sent out quite a few assets from the Royal Navy – Mounts

Bay and Commando Engineers, and we did a bit of a tour going around the Caribbean territories to demonstrate the capability that was there to help. I remember being in Montserrat and seeing the Royal Montserrat Defence Force, I thought, 'Why don't all our overseas territories have the opportunity to have this humanitarian assistance and disaster relief capability, so I wrote to all the Governors, and your previous Governor Martyn Roper came back, in association with the government and we are deeply grateful to the government And that was the start of the regiment.

The Cayman Islands Veterans Association ("CIVA") is a charitable, not-for-profit organization that seeks to ensure that every ex-serviceman or woman in the Cayman Islands has someone to whom they can turn for help when they need it.

The poppy appeal will continue until Remembrance Day, 11 Nov.

On Friday, 4 October, the Premier and Minister for Education, the Honourable Juliana O'Con-

nor-Connolly, led a high-level regional delegation on a visit to three government schools: Red Bay Primary School, the Lighthouse School and the John Gray High School. The visit was aimed at showcasing local education innovations.

Notable among attendees were the Honourable Sharie B. de Castro, Minister for Education for the British Virgin Islands, the Honourable Ms. Dee-Ann Kentish-Rogers, Minister for Social Development & Education-Anguilla, the Honourable Octavia Alfred, Minister of Education- Dominica, the Honourable Troy Liburd, Minister for Education-Nevis, the Honourable Curtis M. King, Minister of Education and National Reconciliation-St Vincent & the Grenadines, the Honourable Rachel Taylor, Minister for Education-Turks & Caicos, Senator David Andrew, Minister for Education-Grenada, Dr. Didicus Jules, Director General of the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS), Mr. Wayne Wesley, CEO and Registrar of CXC, Mr. Isaac Solomon, President of the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) and other CDB, MOE and DES officials.

Minister Sharie B. de Castro of the British Virgin Islands expressed her admiration for the Cayman Islands' education facilities, noting, "It is extremely overwhelming to see the progress, the consideration in terms of infrastructure and resources and to witness what a new school model should be." She likewise underscored the importance of partnership between the two overseas territories, especially her efforts to enhance infrastructural development in the Virgin Islands.

Anguilla's Minister for Social Development & Education, the Honourable Ms. Dee-Ann Kentish-Rogers, commended the Lighthouse School on its da-

ta-driven and research-based approach, describing it as 'cutting-edge'. "I think such an approach is the best thing for education irrespective of whether you are looking at a SEN perspective or a regular school to always be mindful of the data," the Minister noted.

The visiting officials were part of a delegation of approximately 150 persons in the Cayman Islands for the Regional Transforming Education Symposium and Policy Dialogue, held by the CDB co-hosted by the Ministry of Education, from 2-4 October.

Mark Ray, Director of the Department of Education Services (DES), highlighted the symposium's significance. "We are excited about the wealth of knowledge and experience that came to these shores from across the region, and we were able to have some wonderful dialogue. We discussed the future of education within the region and sharing experiences and resources. We had the opportunity to share with delegates what we are doing in our system, got some positive feedback and learned a lot from them. The sessions have been beneficial to us all, and we look forward to more regional dia-

The Premier and Minister for Education, the Honourable Juliana O'Connor-Connolly, expressed her satisfaction with the symposium and related activities. "The last two days have been extremely delightful for me to see that within the Caribbean we still have that synergy and that thirst to pursue excellence in education and the Cayman Islands is well on its way to achieving that."

## RCIPS and the Ministry of Health & Wellness Warns about Dangerous Drug "Gummies" and Associated Serious Health Risks

On Monday, 7 October the RCIPS reported a case of two juveniles who were rushed to hospital, due to medical issues experienced after ingestion of a drug.

Investigations have revealed that the drug consumed comes in the form of a candy, commonly known as "gummies", which contain THC (illegal in Cayman), the psychoactive compound found in marijuana, which when consumed causes significant changes in mood and behavior and can cause strong sedation, potentially rendering a person unconscious.

Subsequently, on Wednesday 10 October, a joint operation by CBC, supported by RCIPS recovered a significant batch of THC infused products, including gummies, from two commercial premises, which had recently been imported to Cayman. An example of the range of product types is provided for public awareness.

From a public safety perspective, the police and the Ministry of Health & Wellness, on behalf of Chief Medical Officer, Dr Gent, wish to warn the community to be aware of these drugs. "These products are dangerous substances that when consumed can have serious health consequences for the user", says Dr Gent. "These products, which are manufactured in the USA, have a dosage that is designed for adult con-



sumption, whereas in children they will cause severe harm".

The Ministry of Health, the RCIPS, CBC and other relevant heads of department will be meeting to agree next steps to take action on this issue. "These products represent a serious risk of harm in our community, especially to children", says Chief Superintendent Brad Ebanks.


Parents are being encouraged to warn their children about the risks of these products, and monitor their children's ac-



tivities and behaviors. If you have any suspicions or concerns about drug use, you are encouraged to contact the Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) at 649-6000.

If you or someone you know comes into contact with these drugs, do not consume them. If anyone has any information about these drugs, in particular where they have been sourced from, please contact 911.

"I think the thing that excites me most about my job is the ability to make a difference with what we are entrusted in, which is groundwater protection."


#### William Belfond- IT Support Specialist at Foster's

## Douglas comes off bench to lift Cayman to key win over BVI in Concacaf Nations League play

Saint Kitts — Dimetri Douglas scored just seconds after entering the match to lift the Cayman Islands Men's National Team to a 1-0 win over British Virgin Islands in Cayman's penultimate Concacaf Nations League group match Saturday, 12 Oct. at Warner Park.

Douglas came on with the score knotted at 0 in the 69th minute and Cayman setting up for a corner kick. He ran onto the pitch and settled into his position in the box just as Cayman's Zachary Scott whipped the corner to the penalty spot, which Douglas headed to the far post past keeper Simon Cross for the winner.


"I feel nice, it means a lot to me to just come on and score on [my] first touch of the game," Douglas said. "I was just thankful that I scored the winning goal."

Douglas' goal provided a spark for a Cayman attack that statistically dominated the match but struggled to break through. Cayman finished the match with a 5-0 advantage in shots on goal and outshot BVI 15-2 overall. Cayman also had 10 corner kicks to BVI's two.

Still, the go-ahead score eluded Cayman until Douglas' 69th-minute header.

"Dimitri is a player who is already long time training with us, but he has never got the chance to perform in a Nations League match or World Cup qualification match," Cayman Islands Men's National Team Head Coach Joey Jap Tjong said. "I must say, he really improved. I kept my confidence in him and this was the moment. I took him by his head, I looked him in the eves and I said, 'the only thing you're going to do is score. You go in and nothing else. You are going to score because that's what





your task is now because we need the three points and this is how you're going to get your chance and take your chance.' You know, that's what he did." Cayman Islands goalkeeper Lachlin

Lambert posted his third clean sheet in the last five matches while Cayman's backline ensured he remained unbothered for most of the day.

With the win, Cayman remains in second place in Group C of League C of the Concacaf Nations League competition. The team can qualify for the competition's Play-In stage either by winning Group C or finishing as the best second-place finisher of the three groups.

Cayman's final Group Stage match comes at 2:30 p.m. (Cayman time) on Tuesday, 15 Oct. versus St. Kitts and Nevis, which beat Cayman 4-1 in their previous

There are several scenarios which would see Cayman qualify through to the next round. A win versus St. Kitts and Nevis on Tuesday would punch a ticket through the Play-In. A draw would also do it should Bahamas lose to Barbados in their Group A finale that same day. Cayman could still potentially advance without a win or draw, depending on the outcome of that match and the Group B finale between Belize and Turks Caicos.

Jap Tjong said he wants to see the team start to put away more of its chances, which will be key to its success moving

"We have to learn to break through good defending walls because (BVI) had a good defending wall," he said.

"We had a lot of chances. The first 10 minutes, we could have scored already three goals and if you score those goals, then it's a difference. And we didn't, so we are making it difficult for ourselves."

The fourth edition of the CNL kicked off in September with matches across all three Leagues (A, B, and C). Highlights included Cayman's Elijah Seymour scoring the competition's 1,000th goal. The match results and standings are available here.

A total of 37 CNL matches are scheduled for this week, concluding Group Stage play for Leagues A and C, while League B will play through November. The CNL Play-In will take place during the FIFA Match Window of November. It will consist of a single direct elimination round and eight teams: the fifth and sixth-place finishers from the League A Groups and the group winners and the best second-place finisher from League C. The group winners of League C  $\,$ will be promoted to League B, as will the best second-place team.
