





## **Premier Congratulates Jordan Crooks for His Achievements**

Premier Honourable Juliana O'Connor-Connolly has extended heartfelt congratulations to Caymanian sports ambassador, Jordan Crooks for his historic victory and record-breaking achievements at the World Short Course Swimming Championships in Budapest, Hungary, over the weekend. Crooks won the gold medal in the 50-metre freestyle on Sunday, 15 December with a time of 20.19s.

This followed an impressive record-breaking performance in the preliminary round on Saturday, 14 December where he erased the 20.16s record set in 2020 by American Caeleb Dressel, in the morning heats. He later clocked 19.90s in the semi-finals to become the fastest man in swimming over the 50m distance.

"Jordan Crook's remarkable achievements have been cemented in sports history. He will forever be known as the first man to break the sub-20 barrier in the 50-m freestyle. With his incredible performance, he has taken his place amongst the pantheon of the world's greatest swimmers," said Premier O'Connor-Connolly.

She further added, "Jordan's spectacular performance on the world stage is a demonstration of his talent, discipline, unwavering commitment, and persistent pursuit of excellence. His achievements are proof that no goal is beyond reach. He has brought immense pride and joy to the Cayman Islands and will serve to inspire future generations of Caymanian and international athletes."

The Cayman Islands Government has expressed profound gratitude and joined in welcoming Mr Crooks home at the Owen Roberts International Airport on Tuesday, 17 December.

## **Passengers Arrested for Marijuana Importation**

On Thursday, 28 November 2024, Customs and Border Control (CBC) officers apprehended a male Canadian national upon his arrival at Owen Roberts International Airport (ORIA) on a flight from Toronto, Canada.

An x-ray examination of his luggage revealed irregularities in one of his bags and upon physical inspection uncovered thirty-four (34) clear, vacuum-sealed packages containing marijuana. The passenger was arrested and later charged with importation and possession with intent to supply 29.15 lbs. of marijuana.

On Monday, 9 December 2024, he appeared before the Summary Court and pleaded guilty to both charges. He was remanded to His Majesty Cayman Islands Prison Service (HMCIPS).

In another incident, CBC officers seized approximately 50 lbs. of marijuana from a female Canadian national arriving from Toronto, Canada on Thursday, 12 December 2024. The passenger was arrested for importation and possession with intent to supply. She appeared before the Summary Court on Monday, 16 December where she was remanded to Fairbanks Female Prison.

CBC Senior Deputy Director Kevin Walton stated, "The rising demand for high-grade marijuana has led to significant changes in smuggling routes and we have seen an increase in importation. The higher the potency of THC, the greater the psychological effects, particularly for marijuana produced in North America. Passengers must remember that while marijuana extracts and tinctures are permitted for medical or therapeutic purposes when prescribed by a medical doctor in the Cayman Islands, the recreational use, possession, and importation of marijuana remain illegal in the Cayman Islands."

# Migrant Vessel Spotted and One Disembark

A vessel with ten (10) male migrants was spotted off the Pedro Castle area of Grand Cayman on Wednesday, 11 December 2024 at approximately 1:30pm. Upon being sighted, the vessel was observed traveling in a westerly direction.

A Cayman Islands Port Authority vessel was the first to establish contact and initially monitored the situation at sea. Subsequently, a Cayman Islands Coast Guard (CICG) vessel arrived on the scene, maintained surveillance of the migrant vessel, and took on board the lone male migrant who no longer wanted to continue the journey.

The CICG transported the lone migrant to shore after which Customs & Border Control (CBC) Service (CBC) received the migrant who was later transported to the CBC Detention Facility for processing.

The CICG shadowed the migrant vessel out to sea until they were no longer visible.



## Police Investigate MVA Involving Three Vehicles in Bodden Town

Around 10:10PM, Tuesday 17 December, police responded to a report of a MVA involving three vehicles, a white Honda Civic, a white Mazda Verisa, and a blue Honda Accord, on Bodden Town Road in the vicinity of Midland Acres.


The occupants of all three vehicles, including two women, a man and a child were taken to George Town Hospital for treatment of serious but non-life threatening injuries. Two of the drivers, a 29-year-old woman of George Town and a 40-year-old man of North Side, were arrested on suspicion of DUI. The third driver has since been discharged from the hospital. Initial investigations suggest that the driver of the Honda Civic was racing another vehicle when the collision occurred.

"Having only just commenced Operation Winter Guardian on Monday 16 December, this incident is disheartening to see", says Superintendent Richard Barrow, who overseas Eastern Districts/Sister Islands. "An innocent child who was travelling in one of the vehicles is amongst those that received serious injuries due to the inconsiderate and reckless driving behavior of motorists. Early investigations suggest that speed and likely alcohol, combined with racing were factors that led to this collision. In other words, this incident was completely avoidable. Instead of looking



forward to Christmas, this child now has to deal with the trauma both mental and physical of being a victim of a serious road collision".

The collision is currently under investigation by the Traffic & Roads Policing Unit and officers are seeking to speak with anyone who may have witnessed the collision to call 649-6254 or the Bodden Town Police Station on 947-2220
