# Cabinet Office corrects misinformation from Local Talk Show



“We are ready,” he affirmed. “The team has been working very hard since late last year preparing for the possibility of a general election. Once the actual date was announced, we power-shifted into full gear. We are hard at work on all fronts; training, preparing equipment, ordering supplies and getting ready.”

Mr Howell is confident that voter registration for the 2025 election will exceed the 24,000 for the 2021 poll. (At the time of recording this edition of Cayman Conversation the number stood at 23,829 with just over a week to go to the January 15th registration deadline).

“The interest has been quite high,” he reported, noting a steady rise since the last voter registration in October.

Regarding youth voter registration and participation in the electoral process, the Supervisor of Elections said efforts by the Ministry of Youth Affairs, the university and the youth themselves are resulting in “some significant interest” by young people.

However, one area of concern is a development that has been drawn to the attention of the Elections Office in which some politicians and their agents are incorrectly advising voters on changing their voting district.

“What we are gathering is that individuals who are canvassing are supplying forms that are change-of-address forms, and in some cases, individuals are signing the forms without reading the details. And those details are moving them from one electoral district to the next.”

He also said that other persons are deliberately changing their address to a different location in order to vote for a preferred candidate in a different constituency.

Mr Howell warns that this is a breach of the Elections Law and could result in a fine of

KYD\$500 or three months in prison.

He also highlighted a further risk faced by those caught breaking the law.

“All of the claims and objections including objections from the Returning Officer go before the Revising Officer who is the Chief Magistrate. And that happens in March. If they are struck off the list in March they would end up not likely to vote in any electoral district at all.”

The upcoming election is expected to follow the general pattern of the last poll in 2021 as Parliament did not accept some of the recommendations made by the observer mission of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association, especially regarding redrawing district boundaries and some aspects of voter eligibility.

Those were considered impractical given the local dynamics of the Cayman Islands.

Mr Howell, who has also been a member of CPA election observer missions in other countries, noted that while the recommenda-

tions seek to follow international standards, “there are not very many countries in the world whose working population of expatriate workers exceeds the adult population of citizens or belongers, so that wasn’t a recommendation that was suitable for our scenario.”

However, while Elections Supervisor Howell feels that there are aspects of the Elections Law which need to be amended and updated, among them campaign financing and voter registration deadline, he is confident that the Cayman Islands electoral laws and processes “are quite robust” in general.

Meanwhile, with potential candidates now coming forward and with the Elections Office aiming to have maximum voter registration, a high turnout is already being anticipated for the April 30th election.

For this year’s election, once more Cayman



is expected to show a good election participation rate of around 70 per cent (and possibly higher) turnout, compared to elsewhere in the region.

# HSA implements photo badge system for inpatient visitors

► Effective Tuesday, 14 January 2025, all persons visiting patients within HSA's wards will be required to have their photo taken in order to be issued a temporary photo ID badge.

The Health Services Authority (HSA) is enhancing its visitor policy by implementing a new system that issues temporary photo identification (ID) badges to visitors of patients in inpatient areas. The new system aligns with current global hospital standards, making it easier for staff to identify visitors, which speeds up verification processes and improves hospital efficiency.

Currently visitors must check in and out at the Information Booth in the main entrance (Atrium), with the exception of visitors to Accident & Emergency (A&E). Effective Tuesday, 14 January 2025 all

those visiting patients within HSA's wards will be required to have their photo taken. The photo will be used to produce a photo badge that will then be provided to the visitor for them to have access to these secured areas and for staff within these areas to easily identify them. Visitors are required to present a government-issued photo ID (e.g. passport, driver's license, voter's card, work ID) at check-in as usual.

CEO Lizzette Yearwood said, "This new photo ID badge system is an easy and effective way to increase current building security measures by identifying every-

one who enters our hospital. Visitor photo ID is a simple system that is being used at many of the leading hospitals across the United States and other countries, and it has proved to be very effective.

"This is a measure that will protect visitors and their loved ones who we've been entrusted to care for and help to reduce misunderstandings or delays, especially in busy areas or sensitive zones. Photos add an additional layer of security by preventing badge swapping or misuse. Also, in case of an emergency, having a photo of each visitor can assist in identification and evacuation efforts," she continued.

Inpatient areas include the Paediatric, Critical Care, Maternity and Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), Ambulatory Care Unit (ACU), Surgical, and Medical Units.

This is the first stage of a system the HSA plans to further expand to other visitors to the hospital. This initiative aligns with its commitment to protecting visitors' information in accordance with HSA's Privacy Policy. ## Public Accounts Committee to Hold Two Hearings in January on Auditor General's Reports

The Public Accounts Committee (PAC) of the Cayman Islands Parliament will convene two public hearings on Thursday, 23rd January 2025, commencing at 10:00 a.m. and concluding by 4:00 p.m. The proceedings will be broadcast live on CIGTV and streamed on YouTube to ensure public accessibility.

The hearings will examine two reports from the Auditor General, Mrs. Sue Winspear, and will feature testimonies from key senior leadership witnesses from relevant departments within the civil service. The reports to be discussed are available for public review on the Office of the Auditor General's website, [auditorgeneral.gov.ky](http://auditorgeneral.gov.ky), though they have not yet been tabled in the Parliament, as the Standing Orders allows for the PAC to prepare its own report before the Auditor General's report is laid on the table.

The morning session, beginning at 10:00 a.m. and concluding at 12:30 p.m., will focus on the Auditor General's report, Financial Reporting of the Cayman Islands Government: General Report 31 December 2023, published in November 2024. Senior public and civil servants from the Port Authority of the Cayman Islands, the Ministry of Planning, Agriculture, Housing and Infrastructure, and the Cayman

Islands Monetary Authority will attend as witnesses during the morning session. This report provides an in-depth analysis of the financial outcomes for the year 2023, including audit opinions and audit matters. It highlights key achievements while addressing concerns regarding the government's financial reporting practic-

es and the quality of financial statements.

The afternoon session, scheduled to run from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., will examine the Auditor General's report, The Government's Approach to Sustainable Economic Development, published also in November 2024. Senior civil servants from the Ministry of Finance & Economic Development,

and the Ministry of Planning, Agriculture, Housing and Infrastructure, will attend as witnesses during the afternoon session. This report evaluates the government's strategies and initiatives for fostering sustainable economic growth. It identifies successes as well as opportunities for improvement to support long-term economic stability and development.

The PAC is a standing committee of the Cayman Islands Parliament responsible for examining the public accounts and ensuring transparency and accountability in government financial operations. The current members of the PAC are:

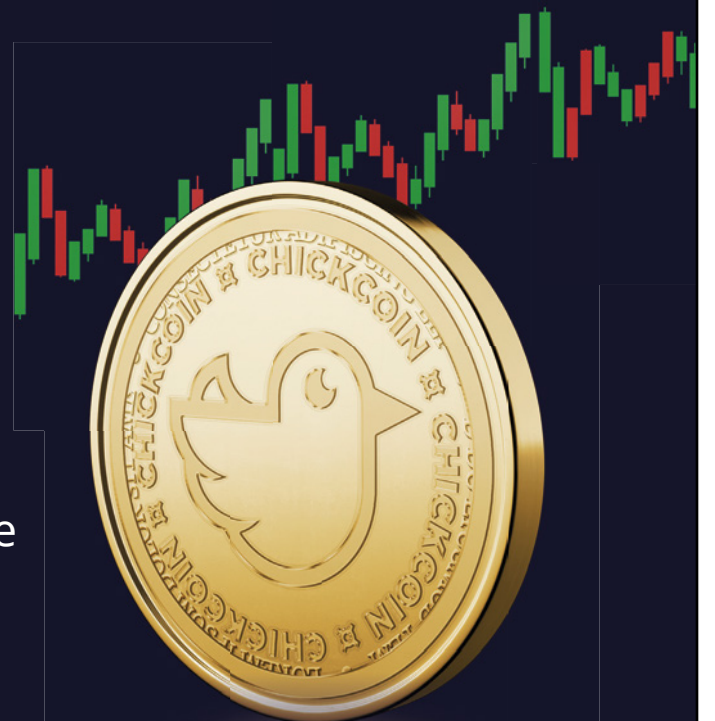

# Warning Issued for False Voter Registration Practices

The Elections Office wishes to address recent complaints and concerns regarding individuals intentionally or inadvertently submitting false information on voter registration and change of circumstances forms to fraudulently vote in electoral districts where they do not reside.

This is a serious offence under the law, and all citizens are urged to adhere strictly to the laws governing voter registration. There are severe penalties for violating Section 11 (3) of the Elections Act, which pertains to knowingly making false statements. Offenders are liable to a fine of five hundred dollars and up to three months' imprisonment upon conviction.

The Elections Office wishes to emphasise that submitting false information not only undermines the integrity of the electoral process but also erodes public confidence in our democratic system. In response to



these concerns, Registering Officers are exercising heightened vigilance in reviewing and verifying voter registration and change of circumstances forms.

Supervisor of Elections, Mr Wesley Howell, stated, "The Elections Office remains committed to ensuring a fair and transparent electoral process. We urge all Caymanians to act responsibly and in accordance with the law when submitting voter registration forms or other related documents."

Persons signing voter registration and change of address forms supplied or completed by prospective candidates and other persons conducting canvassing are strongly encouraged to read the information carefully and only sign if the contents are true.

If you suspect any instances of fraudulent activity, please report them to the Elections Office immediately by emailing [office@elections.ky](mailto:office@elections.ky) or calling 949-8047.

The final voter registration deadline is Wednesday, 15 January.

### Police Respond to Sudden Death in Bodden Town



Around 7.45PM, Tuesday 7 January, police and other emergency services responded to a report of a man found unresponsive at a residential address in Bodden Town.

A man, aged 49, was pronounced deceased at the scene.

### Police Investigate Aggravated Burglary in Bodden Town

It was reported that on returning home the victim noticed the door to the residence was open. On entering, the victim encountered two masked men brandishing knives. The victim ran from the residence to his vehicle, with the masked men in pursuit. While attempting to escape, one of the masked men was struck by the victims vehicle, and both culprits ran south down Leeward Drive.

The culprits were described as both

being around 5 feet 9 inches tall of slim build and dark complexion. They were both wearing black clothing and face masks.

The matter is currently under investigation. Police are appealing for any witnesses who may have seen the culprits, or have any information regarding the incident, to call the Bodden Town CID at 947-2220

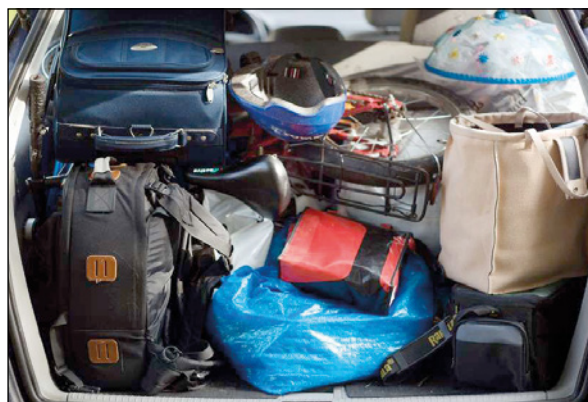

# Sir Hilary appointed Chairman/Chancellor of the United Nations University

The United Nations University at the sitting of its Governance Council on December 7, 2024, in Tokyo, Japan, unanimously appointed Professor Sir Hilary Beckles, its new Chairman/Chancellor, effective May 2025.

Noting that Sir Hilary has established a global reputation as a strategic planner in higher education, respected scholar, and thought leader in development thinking, the Council expressed its keenness to work under his Chairmanship as the University enters its 50th anniversary this year.

Sir Hilary has had a long and senior role in the affairs of the United Nations. He has served in many capacities, among them as Consultant to the annual United Nations Development Report on Latin America and the Caribbean; committees on the Global Future of Higher Education; Vice President and historian to UNESCO's flagship initiative, The Slave Routes Project; and recently as joint Editor of Volume 9 of the UNESCO's General History of Africa series.

He has twice addressed the General As-

sembly of the United Nations, first in support of the international community's declaration of 2015-2024 as the International Decade for People of African Descent; and secondly on matters of Reparatory Justice in a multi-polar political and economic world.

Sir Hilary has also addressed the United Nations Security Council under the Presidency of The Honorable Ralph Gonsalves, Prime Minister of St Vincent and the Grenadines, on the subject of Global Peace in the deepening digitised North-South Divide.

Recently, the United Nations Academic Impact Committee voted The University of the West Indies (The UWI), as the global hub for Sustainable Development Goal 13: Climate Action (SDG 13) on account of Sir Hilary's lead in the establishment of The UWI's International School for Development Justice in 2024, aimed at delivery online postgraduate degree programmes on the SDGs. He had earlier served as Special Advisor to United Nations General Secretary Ban Ki-Moon on Sustainable Development, who he invited and welcomed to The UWI, as well as current General Secretary, Antonio Guterres.

The position of Chairman/Chancellor is honorary, with a mandate to facilitate the leadership of the Rector/Vice-Chancellor of the University, and to guide the Council in a manner that sustains the

confidence of international and internal stakeholders, primarily the leadership of the United Nations, faculty members and managers, private sector investors, and students.

The United Nations University is a global academy, headquartered in Tokyo, with Research and Teaching Institutes in multiple countries. It is an academic and innovation Think Tank and research arm for the world community.

In accepting the appointment, Sir Hilary thanked members of University Council, representatives of the United Nations and other organisations, for their expression of confidence. He assured them that as the University enters its 50th year under the management of its esteemed Vice-Chancellor, and the guidance of Council, it will continue to rise as one of the finest global universities.

He noted that his appointment is a signal honor for The UWI, whose reputation and international connectivity will be enhanced as well as the Caribbean, the Hemisphere and in particular, emerging communities in the Global South.

## *CDB Approves USD900K Grant to UWI to Strengthen Water & Climate Resilience in Jamaica*

The Caribbean Development Bank (CDB/the Bank) has approved a grant of USD909,000 to The University of the West Indies (UWI) to support critical efforts in strengthening water resource management and building climate resilience in Jamaica's coastal and inland communities.

Jamaica is among the 36 most water-stressed countries in the world, according to the World Resources Institute. Despite having an abundant freshwater supply, with 77% of safe yield remaining unused, water distribution across the island is uneven. Primary water sources are concentrated in the north, while population centres, industries, and agricultural areas are predominantly in the south. Rural and semi-urban communities often face chronic water shortages, poor water quality, and unreliable distribution systems. These challenges are further compounded by aging infrastructure, insufficient treatment capacity, and inadequate storage facilities.

Climate change poses an additional threat to Jamaica's water security. The island frequently experiences droughts, hurricanes, tropical storms, extreme rainfall, extensive flooding, leading to infrastructure damage and loss. More than half of Jamaica's nearly three million residents live in coastal areas, making them particularly vulnerable to rising sea levels, storm surges, and shoreline erosion. Addressing these challenges is essential for improving water access and security for all Jamaicans.

The **Technical Assistance - Strengthening Water Resource Management and Climate Resilience in Coastal and Inland Communities - Jamaica** project



targets the coastal community of Port Maria and the inland Kingston and Rio Cobre Basins. Project funds will be used to finance consulting services and procure goods and services aimed at strengthening water resource management and enhancing climate resilience in coastal and inland watershed communities in Jamaica. Activities will include a comprehensive assessment of water resources in the Kingston and Rio Cobre Basins, the design and development of gender-responsive and socially inclusive flood early warning systems, and the enhancement of knowledge, awareness, and capacity building for vulnerable communities. The remaining USD 355,220 of the total project cost of USD1,264,220 will be provided by The UWI as counterpart funding.

*"We are dedicated to fostering sustainable solutions that deliver lasting benefits to the region. This project will help strengthen community resilience to climate change and extreme weather events by improving water quality and security, and flood risk management in Jamaica. A clear understanding of water availability and quality is essential for effective water management. Equality important is enhanced flood forecasting capabilities to better predict and respond to flood events and, consequently, protect lives and livelihoods. We are excited to collaborate with the UWI to bring this project to life,"* said **Dr Yves Robert Persona, Senior Programme Manager, CDB Environmental Sustainability Unit.**

**Dr Debbie-Ann Gordon-Smith, UWI Lecturer and Project Lead,** expressed

gratitude for the Bank's input.

*"Through this grant, The UWI will be able to honour its commitment to supporting national and regional development through improved water resource management and climate resilience in flood prone communities. This project will provide vital assistance to communities that are experiencing significant climate-related challenges, as important steps will be made towards securing Jamaica's water resources and empowering vulnerable populations. We look forward to this collaboration with the CDB and other stakeholders on this journey towards a climate resilient Jamaica."*

The project is being executed under CDB's Caribbean Action for Resilience Enhancement (CARE) Programme, which is funded by the European Union through the 11th European Development Fund's (EDF) Intra-African Caribbean Pacific - European Union (ACP-EU) Natural Disaster Risk Reduction Programme. CARE is a five-year, €14 million initiative to support disaster risk management and climate resilience-building efforts in CDB's 19 Borrowing Member Countries. The programme provides grant financing to support initiatives aimed at improving governance on disaster risk management and climate change adaptation.

CDB has previously provided grant funding to UWI under CARE for the implementation of the Climate Systems, Techniques, and Resources for Improved Decision-Making, Education, and Sustainability as well as provided technical assistance to the Water Resources Authority to upgrade and expand the flood early warning system in the Bog Walk Gorge.

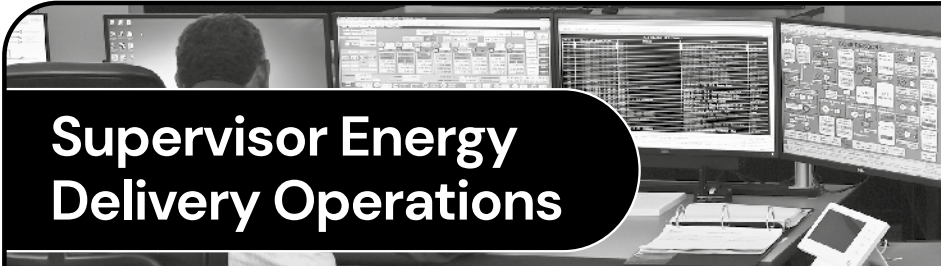
